(2) A review period is not required prior to a vote 18 19 being taken on final passage of the same bill in the 20 nonoriginating house, provided the bill is not amended. If a 21 bill is amended, the amendment being a bill previously 22 furnished pursuant to this rule, another review period is not required. If, however, the amendment was not previously 23 furnished pursuant to this rule, another 72-hour public review 24 25 period shall be provided before a vote is taken on final 26 passage. 27 (2) (3) If a bill is returned to the house in which the 28 bill originated and the originating house does not concur in all the amendments or adds additional amendments, no further 29 30 action shall be taken on the bill by the nonoriginating house, 31

7 (4) (4) (5) A copy of the bill, a copy of the bill with 8 amendments adopted by the nonoriginating house, or the 9 conference committee report shall be furnished to each member 10 of the Legislature, the Governor, the Chief Justice of the 11 Supreme Court, and each member of the Cabinet. Copies for the Governor, Chief Justice and members of the Cabinet shall be 12 furnished to the official's office in the Capitol or Supreme 13 Court Building. A member's copy shall be furnished to the 14 15 member's desk in the appropriate chamber. The Secretary of the Senate shall be responsible for furnishing copies under this 16 17 rule for Senate bills, House bills as amended by the Senate, and conference committee reports on Senate bills. The Clerk of 18 19 the House shall be responsible for furnishing copies under 20 this rule for House bills, Senate bills as amended by the House, and conference committee reports on Senate bills. The 21 22 Clerk of the House shall be responsible for furnishing copies under this rule for House bills, Senate bills as amended by 23 24 the House, and conference committee reports on House bills. 25 (5)(6) The 72-hour public review period shall begin to

run upon completion of the furnishing of copies required to be provided herein. The Speaker of the House <u>and</u> or the President of the Senate, as appropriate, shall be informed of the completion time and such time shall be announced on the floor prior to vote on final passage in each house and shall be

Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays shall be included in the computation under this rule. 2.2--General Appropriations Bill; Definition For the purposes of Joint Rule 2, the term "general б appropriations bill" means a bill which provides for the salaries of public officers and other current expenses of the state and contains no subject other than appropriations. A bill which contains appropriations which are incidental and necessary solely to implement a substantive law is not included within this term.
