license number or other means of identification of the person

Upon request, information within a portion of 3 such record pertaining to a specific transaction shall be 4 provided to an insurer or a consumer. 5 (4) Prohibition; penalties.--(a) It is unlawful for any person to knowingly 6 7 possess, sell, or install a stolen uninstalled airbag, any 8 airbag from which the manufacturer's part identification 9 number has been removed, altered, or defaced, or an airbag taken from a stolen motor vehicle. Any person who violates 10 11 this provision commits a felony of the third degree, 12 punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 13 775.084, Florida Statutes. (b) Any person who fails to maintain complete and 14 15 accurate records or prepare complete and accurate documents 16 required by this act commits a misdemeanor of the first 17 degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, 18 Florida Statutes. 19 Section 2.
