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AIDS cases in the nation and the second highest number of pediatric AIDS cases, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the epidemic is reaching alarming proportions in the state's minority communities, with approximately 59 percent of reported AIDS cases and 75 percent of reported HIV cases occurring among blacks, Hispanics, and other minorities, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that HIV and AIDS infections are the leading cause of death for black males and black females between the ages of 25 and 44, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that members of the black community tend to develop AIDS within 1 month after being diagnosed with HIV and to die within 1 month after being diagnosed with AIDS, which indicates that members of this community, more than any other, fail to avail themselves to early testing and treatment, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that black women who are heterosexually infected with HIV are the fastest growing group of infected persons, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the total medical and related lifetime costs for a patient infected with HIV may reach \$175,000 or more, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that sustained, comprehensive prevention efforts can have a substantial impact on slowing the course of the HIV and AIDS epidemic, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature intends to decrease the number of deaths of minorities due to HIV and AIDS by increasing public awareness, increasing early detection and treatment of HIV and AIDS in the state's minority communities, and by increasing the coordination of HIV and AIDS prevention and

1 treatment efforts in the state's minority communities, NOW, 2 THEREFORE, 3 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 4 5 6 Section 1. The Minority HIV and AIDS Task Force. --(1) There is created within the Department of Health the Minority HIV and AIDS Task Force to develop and provide

- 8 9 specific recommendations to the Governor, the Legislature, and the Department of Health on ways to strengthen HIV and AIDS 10 11 prevention programs and early intervention and treatment 12 efforts in the state's black, Hispanic, and other minority 13 communities, as well as ways to address the many needs of the 14 state's minorities infected with AIDS and their families.
 - (2) The Secretary of Health shall appoint at least 15 members to the task force. The members must include, but need not be limited to, representatives from:

 - (c) Minority treatment providers.

28	(1) The Department of Health shall develop and

directed towards minorities who are at risk of HIV infection.

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31 The campaign shall include television, radio, and outdoor

advertising; public service announcements; and peer-to-peer outreach. Each campaign message and concept shall be evaluated with members of the target group to ensure its effectiveness. The campaign shall provide information on the risk of HIV and AIDS infection and strategies to follow for prevention, early detection, and treatment. The campaign shall use culturally sensitive literature and educational materials and promote the development of individual skills for behavior modification.

- The Department of Health shall establish four positions within the department for HIV and AIDS regional minority coordinators and one position for a statewide HIV and AIDS minority coordinator. The coordinators shall facilitate statewide efforts to implement and coordinate HIV and AIDS prevention and treatment programs. The statewide coordinator shall report directly to the chief of the Bureau of HIV and AIDS within the Department of Health.
- (3) The Department of Health shall, with assistance from the Minority HIV and AIDS Task Force and the statewide coordinator, plan and conduct a statewide Black Leadership Conference on HIV and AIDS by January 2000. The conference shall provide workshops for minority organizations in building skills and improving an organization's capacity to conduct HIV and AIDS prevention and treatment programs.
- Section 3. The sum of \$500,000 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Health for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act during the 1999-2000 fiscal year.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.

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********** SENATE SUMMARY Establishes the Minority HIV and AIDS Task Force within the Department of Health for the purpose of developing recommendations on ways to strengthen HIV and AIDS prevention and treatment programs in minority prevention and treatment programs in minority communities.
