7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

9 Section 1. Subparagraph 2. of paragraph (b) of
10 subsection (3) of s. 11.42, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

11
12 Reviser's note.--The cited subparagraph, which
13 relates to prior-existing job qualifications
14 for employees in positions associated with the
15 Florida Education Finance Program full-time
16 enrollment verification function assigned to
17 the Auditor General pursuant to s. 229.565(2)
18 expired pursuant to its own terms, effective
19 July 1, 1998.

21 Section 2. Sections 88.011, 88.012, 88.021, 88.031,
22 88.0405, 88.041, 88.051, 88.0515, 88.061, 88.065, 88.081,
23 88.091, 88.101, 88.105, 88.111, 88.121, 88.131, 88.141,
24 88.151, 88.161, 88.171, 88.181, 88.191, 88.193, 88.211,
25 88.221, 88.231, 88.235, 88.241, 88.251, 88.255, 88.261,
26 88.271, 88.281, 88.291, 88.295, 88.297, 88.311, 88.321,

30 Reviser's note.--The cited sections, which

4 not repealed by a "current session" of the
5 Legislature, they may be omitted from the
6 Florida Statutes 1999 only through a reviser's
7 bill duly enacted by the Legislature. See s.

10 Section 3. Section 201.131, Florida Statutes, is
11 repealed.

13 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
14 relates to metering machines used to apply
15 stamps for the excise tax on documents, was
16 repealed by s. 13, ch. 96-395, Laws of Florida,
17 effective April 1, 1997. Since the section was
18 not repealed by a "current session" of the
19 Legislature, it may be omitted from the Florida
20 Statutes 1999 only through a reviser's bill
21 duly enacted by the Legislature. See s.
22 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

24 Section 4. Subsection (6) of section 212.055, Florida
25 Statutes, 1998 Supplement, as amended by section 9 of chapter
26 98-342, Laws of Florida, is repealed.

27
28 Reviser's note.--This subsection, which relates
29 to the small county indigent care surtax,
30 expired pursuant to its own terms, effective
31 October 1, 1998.

1 Section 5. Section 231.1713, Florida Statutes, is
2 repealed.

3
4 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
5 specifies school system personnel not required
6 to be refingerprinted or rescreened, was
7 repealed by s. 14, ch. 96-369, Laws of Florida,
8 effective January 1998. Since the section was
9 not repealed by a "current session" of the
10 Legislature, it may be omitted from the Florida
11 Statutes 1999 only through a reviser's bill
12 duly enacted by the Legislature. See s.
13 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

14
15 Section 6. Section 231.601, Florida Statutes, is
16 repealed.

17
18 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
19 provides intent relating to state policy for in
20 service training of instructional personnel,
21 was repealed by s. 21, ch. 85-238, Laws of
22 Florida, effective October 1, 1995. Since the
23 section was not repealed by a "current session"
24 of the Legislature, it may be omitted from the
25 Florida Statutes 1999 only through a reviser's
26 bill duly enacted by the Legislature. See s.
27 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

29 Section 7. Paragraph (j) of subsection (10) of section
30 240.1201, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is repealed.

1 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which
2 provides for residency status for tuition
3 purposes for persons relocated from another
4 state to a military establishment in this state
5 as a result of the Base Realignment and Closure
6 Act for the 1996-1997 fiscal year only, expired
7 pursuant to its own terms, effective July 1,
8 1997.

10 Section 8. Paragraph (c) of subsection (5) of section
11 240.605, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, as amended by
12 section 9 of chapter 98-71, Laws of Florida, and section 14 of
13 chapter 98-398, Laws of Florida, is repealed.

14
15 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which
16 provides for funding for the Florida resident
17 access grant in the amount set forth in the
18 General Appropriations Act for the 1997-1998
19 fiscal year only, was repealed by s. 28, ch.
20 95-430, Laws of Florida, as amended by s. 16,
21 ch. 96-420, Laws of Florida, and s. 10, ch.
22 97-246, Laws of Florida, effective July 1,
23 1998. Since the paragraph was not repealed by a
24 "current session" of the Legislature, it may be
25 omitted from the Florida Statutes 1999 only
26 through a reviser's bill duly enacted by the
27 Legislature. See s. 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

29 Section 9. Subparagraph 4. of paragraph (e) of
30 subsection (7) of section 253.025, Florida Statutes, 1998
31 Supplement, is repealed.

1 Reviser's note.--The cited subparagraph, which
2 provides authorization for the District Court
3 of Appeal, Fifth District, to pay up to 150
4 percent of the approved appraised value for the
5 acquisition of real properties required for
6 expansion, expired pursuant to its own terms,
7 effective July 1, 1997.

8
9 Section 10. Subparagraph 3. of paragraph (b) of
10 subsection (12) of section 259.032, Florida Statutes, 1998
11 Supplement, is repealed.

12
13 Reviser's note.--The cited subparagraph, which
14 provides for payment in lieu of taxes to Glades
15 County, for the 1997-1998 fiscal year only,
16 where a privately owned and operated prison
17 leased to the state was opened within the last
18 2 years for which no other state moneys were
19 allocated, expired pursuant to its own terms,
20 effective July 1, 1998.

22 Section 11. Subsection (22) of section 287.057,
23 Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is repealed.

25 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
26 provides for procurement and retention of the
27 services of a professional administrator for
28 the State Employees' Health Self-Insurance Plan
29 and requires departments to follow good
30 purchasing practices of state procurement to

1 the extent practical, expired pursuant to its
2 own terms, effective July 1, 1998.

4 Section 12. Subsection (5) of section 287.073, Florida
5 Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is repealed.

6
7 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
8 provides for an exemption from s. 287.073 for
9 expenditures for the 1997-1998 fiscal year by
10 any department for projects funded from funds
11 in Specific Appropriation 1495 of the 1997-1998
12 General Appropriations Act, expired pursuant to
13 its own terms, effective July 1, 1998.

14
15 Section 13. Subsection (8) of section 290.0065,
16 Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is repealed.

17
18 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
19 authorizes certain amendments of the boundaries
20 of noncontiguous areas of specified enterprise
21 zones, expired pursuant to its own terms,
22 effective July 1, 1997.

24 Section 14. Sections 290.0301, 290.0311, 290.032,
25 290.033, 290.034, 290.035, 290.036, 290.0365, 290.037,
26 290.038, 290.039, and 290.0395, Florida Statutes, are
27 repealed.

28
29 Reviser's note.--The cited sections, which
30 comprise the Community Development Corporation
31 Support and Assistance Program Act, were

1 repealed by ch. 91-262, Laws of Florida,
2 effective June 30, 1998. Since the sections
3 were not repealed by a "current session" of the
4 Legislature, they may be omitted from the
5 Florida Statutes 1999 only through a reviser's
6 bill duly enacted by the Legislature. See s.

9 Section 15. Subsection (13) of section 327.25, Florida
10 Statutes, is repealed.

12 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
13 provides for proration of registration fees on
14 a monthly basis for the period of June 1, 1997,
15 through May 31, 1998, for purposes of
16 implementing the birth month schedule of
17 registration, expired pursuant to its own
18 terms, effective June 1, 1998.

20 Section 16. Subsection (4) of section 372.672, Florida
21 Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is repealed.

22
23 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
24 provides for up to \$50,000 appropriated from
25 the Florida Panther Research and Management
26 Trust Fund for fiscal year 1997-1998 only, for
27 recovering, housing, and maintaining Texas
28 cougars purchased as part of the Florida
29 panther research and management program,
30 expired pursuant to its own terms, effective
31 July 1, 1998.

1 Section 17. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section
2 375.041, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

3
4 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which
5 provides for use of Land Acquisition Trust Fund
6 moneys not pledged for rentals or debt service
7 for specified purposes to be used for lease
8 payments in wildlife management areas for
9 fiscal year 1996-1997 only, expired pursuant to

12 Section 18. Section 376.319, Florida Statutes, as
13 amended by section 618 of ch. 95-148, Laws of Florida, is
14 repealed.

16 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
17 relates to indemnification of response action
18 contractors, was repealed by s. 24, ch. 86-159,
19 Laws of Florida, as amended by s. 7, ch.
20 88-331, Laws of Florida, effective October 1,
21 1997. Since the section was not repealed by a
22 "current session" of the Legislature, it may be
23 omitted from the Florida Statutes 1999 only
24 through a reviser's bill duly enacted by the

27 Section 19. Subsection (10) of section 402.3015,
28 Florida Statutes, is repealed.

8 Section 20. Section 403.7195, Florida Statutes, is
9 repealed.

11 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
12 provides for waste newsprint disposal fees,

16 Section 21. Sections 487.201, 487.202, 487.203,
17 487.204, 487.205, 487.206, and 487.207, Florida Statutes, are
18 repealed.

20 Reviser's note.--The cited sections, which
21 comprise the Florida Agricultural Worker Safety
22 Act, were repealed by s. 28, ch. 94-233, Laws
23 of Florida, effective January 1, 1998. Since

30 Section 22. Subsection (5) of section 550.09511,
31 Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is repealed.

1 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
2 relates to authorizing a jai alai permitholder
3 in a county with only two permitholders, one
4 for dog racing and one for jai alai, to conduct
5 intertrack wagering as a guest during calendar
6 year 1997 if it conducted a full schedule of
7 live gaming during fiscal year 1994-1995 and
8 applied for a license to conduct a full
9 schedule of live gaming during fiscal year
10 1997-1998, was repealed by s. 5, ch. 95-390,
11 Laws of Florida, as amended by s. 5, ch.
12 96-364, Laws of Florida, effective January 1,
13 1998. Since the subsection was not repealed by
14 a "current session" of the Legislature, it may
15 be omitted from the Florida Statutes 1999 only

19 Section 23. Subsection (2) of section 616.261, Florida
20 Statutes, is repealed.

22 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which

25 maintenance, and improvement of the Florida
26 State Fair and the Florida State Fairgrounds,
27 expired pursuant to its own terms, effective
28 July 1, 1997.

30 Section 24. Sections 620.56, 620.565, 620.57, 620.575,
31 620.58, 620.585, 620.59, 620.595, 620.60, 620.605, 620.61,

30 Section 26. Subsection (8) of section 957.04, Florida
31 Statutes, is repealed.

5 municipality or county and associated with the
6 opening and operating of a private correctional
7 facility, expired pursuant to its own terms,
