Section 20.325, Florida Statutes, is 29 amended to read: 30 20.325 Fish and Wildlife Conservation Game and Fresh 31 | Water Fish Commission. -- The Legislature, recognizing the Fish

and Wildlife Conservation Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission as being specifically provided for and authorized by the State Constitution under s. 9, Art. IV, grants rights and privileges to the commission, as contemplated by s. 6, Art. IV of the State Constitution, equal to those of departments established under this chapter, while preserving its constitutional designation and title as a commission.

- (1) The head of the <u>Fish and Wildlife Conservation</u>

  Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission is the commission appointed by the Governor as provided for in s. 9, Art. IV of the State Constitution.
- (2) The following divisions are established within the commission:
  - (a) Division of Administrative Services.
  - (b) Division of Law Enforcement.
  - (c) Division of Freshwater Fisheries.
  - (d) Division of Wildlife.
  - (e) Division of Marine Resources.
- (3) The commission shall appoint an executive director who shall be subject to confirmation by the Florida Senate and upon approval shall serve at the pleasure of the commission.

  The powers, duties, and functions of the commission shall be as prescribed by law.

Section 2. The powers, duties, functions, and jurisdiction as set forth in statutes in effect on March 1, 1998, and staff, equipment, and fund balances of the Marine Fisheries Commission assigned to the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund are transferred by a type two transfer, as defined in section 20.06, Florida Statutes, to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

1 Section 3. The powers, duties, functions, staff, equipment, and fund balances of the Game and Fresh Water Fish 2 3 Commission are transferred by a type two transfer, as defined in section 20.06, Florida Statutes, to the Fish and Wildlife 4 5 Conservation Commission. 6 Section 4. The powers, duties, functions, staff, 7 equipment, facilities, and fund balances of the Department of 8 Environmental Protection, Division of Marine Resources, related to the Office of Fisheries Management, Bureau of 9 10 Marine Resources Regulation and Development, Bureau of 11 Protected Species Management, and the Florida Marine Research Institute are transferred by a type two transfer, to the Fish 12 and Wildlife Conservation Commission. The remaining powers, 13 duties, functions, staff, equipment and fund balances of the 14 Division of Marine Resources relating to the Bureau of Coastal 15 and Aquatic Managed Areas shall remain in the Department of 16 17 Environmental Protection. Section 5. The powers, duties, functions, staff, 18 19 equipment, facilities, and fund balances of the Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Law Enforcement, related 20 to the Office of Enforcement Planning and Policy Coordination, 21 Bureau of Administrative Support, Bureau of Operational 22 Support, and the Bureau of Environmental Law Enforcement, are 23 24 transferred by a type two transfer to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, except for those powers, duties, 25 functions, staff, equipment, facilities, and fund balances of 26 27 the Bureau relating to the Florida Park Patrol, which shall remain in the Department of Environmental Protection and be 28 29 assigned to the Division of Recreation and Parks. The remaining powers, duties, functions, staff, equipment, and 30 31 fund balances of the Division of Law Enforcement relating to

26	In order to ensure statewide and intradepartmental
27	consistency, the department's divisions shall direct the
28	district offices and bureaus on matters of interpretation and
29	applicability of the department's rules and programs.
30	Section 7. The Secretary of the Department of
31	Environmental Protection and the Executive Director of the

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Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission shall each appoint 3 staff members to a transition advisory committee to review and 2 3 determine the appropriate number of positions, up to 60 positions and their related funding levels and sources, from 4 5 the Office of General Counsel and from the Division of 6 Administrative and Technical Services to be transferred from 7 the Department of Environmental Protection to the Fish and 8 Wildlife Conservation Commission to provide legal services and administrative and operational support services, including 9 communications equipment involving the National Crime 10 11 Information System (NCIS) and the Florida Crime Information System (FCIS) which were previously provided to the programs 12 transferred by sections 4 and 5 of this act. The Governor 13 shall appoint a staff member from the Office of Planning and 14 Budget to chair the meetings of the transition advisory 15 committee and to assist in implementing these provisions as 16 17 appropriate with adjustments in the operating budgets of the two agencies involved during Fiscal Year 1999-2000 as provided 18 19 by chapter 216 and providing consultation with the 20 Appropriations Committees in the House of Representatives and 21 the Senate. The Division of Statutory Revision of the 22 Section 8. Office of Legislative Services is directed to prepare a 23 24 reviser's bill for introduction at a subsequent session of the Legislature to change "Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission" 25 to "Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission" and to make 26 27 such further changes as are necessary to conform the Florida 28 Statutes to the organizational changes effected by this act. 29 Section 9. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. 30

SENATE SUMMARY Transfers the Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission, the Marine Fisheries Commission, and some functions of the Department of Environmental Protection to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. Establishes the organizational structure of the commission and the Department of Environmental Protection. Creates a transition advisory committee. Provides for the preparation of a reviser's bill to conform the statutes to organizational changes.
