When 25 26 the carrier is a non-party to the litigation in which the 27 request for health information has been made, it shall be the responsibility of the individual, after notice from the 28 29 carrier, to ensure that a judicial determination is made. 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(a) "Carrier" means any person or entity licensed in this state under chapter 624, chapter 626, chapter 636, or chapter 641. (b) "Health information" means any information, in any form, in the possession of a carrier or a person acting on behalf of a carrier which relates to any physical, mental, or behavioral health or condition of an individual or any member of the individual's family or the provision of or payment for health care to an individual and which identifies such individual or which could be used to identify such individual. For purposes of this act, the term "individual" means a person who is the subject of such health information. Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 1999.
