House Resolution A resolution designating Tuesday, April 13, 1999, as the "International Day of Remembrance," known as Yom Hashoah. WHEREAS, the year 1999 marks the fifty-fourth anniversary of the victories of the United States Armed Forces and the Allies over the German National Socialists regime, ending the war in Europe during World War II, and WHEREAS, this great military victory brought the liberation of the Nazi concentration camps and the end of the Holocaust, during which Nazi Germany conducted the planned systematic annihilation of European Jews and other groups, and WHEREAS, the war-hardened United States soldiers not

15 only liberated the Nazi concentration camps, but also extended 16 their tender compassion and generosity to those few survivors 17 of these camps, and

18 WHEREAS, Americans recognize that each individual 19 citizen is responsible for eternal vigilance against all 20 tyranny and for speaking out against such tyranny, and

21 WHEREAS, in 1994 the Florida Legislature mandated that 22 the history of the Holocaust be taught in public schools, in a manner that leads to an investigation of human behavior, an 23 understanding of the ramifications of prejudice, racism, and 24 stereotyping, and an examination of what it means to be a 25 26 responsible and respectful person, for the purposes of 27 encouraging tolerance of diversity in a pluralistic society 28 and nurturing and protecting democratic values and 29 institutions, and WHEREAS, under federal law, the United States Holocaust 30
