Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 1. Paragraph (k) of subsection (1) of section 125.01, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 125.01 Powers and duties.--(1) The legislative and governing body of a county shall have the power to carry on county government. extent not inconsistent with general or special law, this power includes, but is not restricted to, the power to: (k)1. Provide and regulate waste and sewage collection and disposal, water and alternative water supplies, including, but not limited to, reclaimed water and water from aquifer storage and recovery and desalination systems, and conservation programs.

- 2. The governing body of a county may require that any person within the county demonstrate the existence of some arrangement or contract by which such person will dispose of solid waste in a manner consistent with county ordinance or state or federal law. For any person who will produce special wastes or biomedical waste, as the same may be defined by state or federal law or county ordinance, the county may require satisfactory proof of a contract or similar arrangement by which such special or biomedical wastes will be collected by a qualified and duly licensed collector and disposed of in accordance with the laws of Florida or the Federal Government.
- 3. When the governing body of a county receives notice from the Florida Public Service Commission that the commission has tentatively approved a change in rates for water service or wastewater service in the county, the governing body has 30 days within which it must, by resolution, either approve the new rate or disapprove the new rate and state the reasons for its disapproval. The governing body shall notify the Florida Public Service Commission of its action within 5 days after adopting such a resolution.

Section 2. Subsection (9) is added to section 367.081, Florida Statutes, to read:

367.081 Rates; procedure for fixing and changing.--

(9) After the commission approves a change in water or wastewater rates, it shall notify the governing body of the county in which the utility provides the service of the proposed change at least 40 days before the date the commission proposes for the change to take effect. If the governing body of the county fails to take action to approve the proposed change within 30 days after it receives

3	not take effect. The proposed change may be implemented only
4	with the approval of the governing board of the county.
