Subsection (4) of section 455.565, Florida 14 Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read: 15 16 455.565 Designated health care professionals; information required for licensure.--17 (4)(a) An applicant for initial licensure must submit 18 a set of fingerprints to the Department of Health in 19 20 accordance with s. 458.311, s. 458.3115, s. 458.3124, s. 458.313, s. 459.0055, s. 460.406, or s. 461.006. 21 22 (b) An applicant for renewed licensure who received an initial license in this state after January 1, 1992, must 23 submit a set of fingerprints for the initial renewal of his or 24 her license after January 1, 2000, to the agency regulating 25 26 that profession in accordance with procedures established under s. 458.319, s. 459.008, s. 460.407, or s. 461.007. 27 28 (c) The Department of Health shall submit the 29 fingerprints provided by an applicant for initial licensure to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for a statewide 30 31 criminal history check, and the Florida Department of Law 1

Enforcement shall forward the fingerprints to the Federal 1 2 Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history check 3 of the applicant. The department shall submit the fingerprints provided by an applicant for a renewed license who received an 4 5 initial license in this state after January 1, 1992, to the б Florida Department of Law Enforcement for a statewide criminal 7 history check, and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement 8 shall forward the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history check for the 9 initial renewal of the applicant's license after January 1, 10 11 2000.+For any subsequent renewal of the applicant's license 12 and of any applicant who received an initial license in this 13 state on or before January 1, 1992, the department shall 14 submit the required information for a statewide criminal history check of the applicant. 15 Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 458.319, Florida 16 Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read: 17 458.319 Renewal of license.--18 (1) The department shall renew a license upon receipt 19 20 of the renewal application, evidence that the applicant has actively practiced medicine or has been on the active teaching 21 22 faculty of an accredited medical school for at least 2 years of the immediately preceding 4 years, and a fee not to exceed 23 24 \$500; provided, however, that if the licensee is either a 25 resident physician, assistant resident physician, fellow, 26 house physician, or intern in an approved postgraduate 27 training program, as defined by the board by rule, the fee 28 shall not exceed \$100 per annum. If the licensee has not actively practiced medicine for at least 2 years of the 29 immediately preceding 4 years, the board shall require that 30 31 the licensee successfully complete a board-approved clinical 2

competency examination prior to renewal of the license. 1 2 "Actively practiced medicine" means that practice of medicine 3 by physicians, including those employed by any governmental entity in community or public health, as defined by this 4 5 chapter, including physicians practicing administrative medicine. An applicant for a renewed license must also submit 6 7 the information required under s. 455.565 to the department on 8 a form and under procedures specified by the department, along 9 with payment in an amount equal to the costs incurred by the Department of Health for the statewide criminal background 10 11 check of the applicant. An The applicant for a renewed license 12 who received an initial license in this state after January 1, 13 1992, must submit a set of fingerprints to the Department of 14 Health on a form and under procedures specified by the department, along with payment in an amount equal to the costs 15 16 incurred by the department for a national criminal background check of the applicant for the initial renewal of his or her 17 license after January 1, 2000. If the applicant fails to 18 19 submit either the information required under s. 455.565 or a 20 set of fingerprints to the department as required by this 21 section, the department shall issue a notice of noncompliance, 22 and the applicant will be given 30 additional days to comply. If the applicant fails to comply within 30 days after the 23 notice of noncompliance is issued, the department or board, as 24 appropriate, may issue a citation to the applicant and may 25 26 fine the applicant up to \$50 for each day that the applicant 27 is not in compliance with the requirements of s. 455.565. The 28 citation must clearly state that the applicant may choose, in 29 lieu of accepting the citation, to follow the procedure under s. 455.621. If the applicant disputes the matter in the 30 citation, the procedures set forth in s. 455.621 must be 31

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followed. However, if the applicant does not dispute the 1 2 matter in the citation with the department within 30 days after the citation is served, the citation becomes a final 3 order and constitutes discipline. Service of a citation may be 4 5 made by personal service or certified mail, restricted б delivery, to the subject at the applicant's last known 7 address. The department may not delay renewing a license due 8 to the processing of a statewide criminal history check or a 9 national criminal background check. If an applicant has 10 submitted fingerprints to the department for a national 11 criminal history check upon initial licensure and is renewing 12 his or her license for the first time, then the applicant need 13 only submit the information and fee required for a statewide 14 criminal history check. 15 Section 3. Subsection (1) of section 459.008, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read: 16 459.008 Renewal of licenses and certificates.--17 (1) The department shall renew a license or 18 19 certificate upon receipt of the renewal application and fee. 20 An applicant for a renewed license must also submit the information required under s. 455.565 to the department on a 21 22 form and under procedures specified by the department, along with payment in an amount equal to the costs incurred by the 23 Department of Health for the statewide criminal background 24 check of the applicant. An The applicant for a renewed license 25 26 who received an initial license in this state after January 1, 27 1992, must submit a set of fingerprints to the Department of 28 Health on a form and under procedures specified by the 29 department, along with payment in an amount equal to the costs incurred by the department for a national criminal background 30 31 check of the applicant for the initial renewal of his or her 4

An The applicant for a renewed license who received an initial license in this state after January 1, 1992, must submit a set of fingerprints to the Department of Health on a form and under procedures specified by the department, along with payment in an amount equal to the costs incurred by the department for a national criminal background check of the applicant for the initial renewal of his or her license after January 1, 2000. If the applicant fails to submit either the information required under s. 455.565 or a set of fingerprints to the department as required by this section, the department shall issue a notice of noncompliance, and the applicant will be given 30 additional days to comply. Subsection (1) of section 461.007, Florida 13 Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read: 14 461.007 Renewal of license.--15 (1) The department shall renew a license upon receipt 16 of the renewal application and a fee not to exceed \$350 set by the board. An applicant for a renewed license must also submit 17 the information required under s. 455.565 to the department on 18 19 a form and under procedures specified by the department, along 20 with payment in an amount equal to the costs incurred by the Department of Health for the statewide criminal background 21 22 check of the applicant. An The applicant for a renewed license who received an initial license in this state after January 1, 23 1992, must submit a set of fingerprints to the Department of 24 25 Health on a form and under procedures specified by the 26 department, along with payment in an amount equal to the costs 27 incurred by the department for a national criminal background 28 check of the applicant for the initial renewal of his or her license after January 1, 2000. 4	license after January 1, 1992, to submit a set of fingerprints to the Department of Health for the initial
5	license renewal that occurs after January 1, 2000. Provides for a practitioner who received an initial
6 7	license on or before January 1, 1992, to submit fingerprints for any license renewal that occurs after January 1, 2000.
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
