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Wagering Trust Fund for education, awareness, prevention, and treatment programs for problem and compulsive gamblers. Section 7. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 962 б Specifies that the compulsive gambling program must be implemented with resources specifically appropriated for this purpose. Specifies that the Alcohol, Drug Abuse, and Mental Health Program Office will use the provisions in s. 20.19(17), F.S., 1998 Supp., to select the advocacy organization that will operate the toll-free telephone number for the crisis counseling and referral service. Specifies that the Alcohol, Drug Abuse and Mental Health Program Office will provide the toll free number for public display to the Department of the Lottery, the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, and organizations that conduct bingo.
