5	print a notice of a toll-free problem gambling telephone number on all lottery tickets, advertising, and marketing materials provided to the general public.

7	Removes the requirement that lottery retailers, pari-mutuel permitholders, and organizations conducting bingo open to the
8	public print a statement and a toll-free problem gambling phone number on all advertising and marketing materials
9	provided to the general public.
10	Reduces the number of signs containing the statement and toll-free problem gambling phone number to be posted by pari-mutuel permitholders and organizations conducting bingo
11	open to the public to require posting of signs a tall entrances commonly used by the general public and at each
12	credit location within a pari-mutuel facility.
13	Removes the appropriation of \$2.5 million from General Revenue to establish a nonreverting fund to conduct treatment
