Paragraph (b) of subsection (15) of section 19 20 121.021, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to 21 read: 22 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth 23 24 unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 25 (15)26 (b) Effective October 1, 1978, "special risk member" 27 means a member of the Florida Retirement System who is 28 designated as a special risk member by the division in 29 accordance with s. 121.0515. Such member must be employed as

forth in s. 121.0515. Effective January 1, 2000, the term "special risk member" also includes any member who is employed as a correctional probation officer and meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(d).

Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read:

121.0515 Special risk membership; criteria; designation and removal of classification; credits for past service and prior service; retention of special risk normal retirement date. --

- (2) CRITERIA. -- A member, to be designated as a special risk member, must meet the following criteria:
- (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;
- The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with 31 s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of

the employer or agency of state government. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires or direct supervision of firefighting units, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; or

- (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, superintendents and assistant superintendents shall participate in the Special Risk Class; or—
- (d) The member must be employed as a correctional probation officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or community controllees within institutions of the community; or

the member must be the supervisor of a member or members who 1 have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative 2 3 support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose 4 primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; 5 however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit 6 7 administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class. 8 Section 4. The Legislature finds that a proper and 9 legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees of the state and of its political subdivisions, and the 10 11 dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and retirees, are extended the basic protections afforded by 12 13 governmental retirement systems that provide fair and adequate benefits and that are managed, administered, and funded in an 14 15 actuarially sound manner, as required by Section 14 of Article 16 X of the State Constitution and part VII of chapter 112, 17 Florida Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature determines and declares that the provisions of this act fulfill an important 18 19 state interest. 20 Section 5.
