D. FISCAL COMMENTS:

- 1. <u>Flags</u>: Because DOT has already started implementing the flying of POW/MIA flags at rest areas and has incurred most of the cost of complying with this requirement, this provision of the bill should have little or no fiscal impact.
- 2. <u>Displays</u>: This provision of the bill will have a fiscal impact on DOT. If signs are used for the required displays, the cost is approximately \$150 per sign. However, if plaques are used each one could cost from approximately \$1500 to \$3000. There are currently 72 rest areas affected by the bill. The estimated cost per sign assumes that standard DOT highway sign material will be used for the markers. Therefore, the fiscal impact on DOT is estimated at a minimum of \$10,800 if markers are used, however if granite or bronze plaques are installed the impact could be up to \$216,000.
