30 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
31

1 Section 1. Effective July 1, 2000, section 14.025,
2 Florida Statutes, is repealed.

3
4 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
5 relates to executive powers for year 2000
6 computer remediation, expires pursuant to its
7 own terms, effective July 1, 2000.

8
9 Section 2. Effective July 1, 2000, paragraph (e) of
10 subsection (5) of section 20.171, Florida Statutes, is
11 repealed.

12
13 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which
14 provides for the Division of Safety within the
15 Department of Labor and Employment Security,
16 expires pursuant to its own terms, effective
17 July 1, 2000.

18
19 Section 3. Subsection (3) of section 61.1812, Florida
20 Statutes, is repealed.

21
22 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
23 relates to distribution of specified funds to
24 the Child Support Incentive Trust Fund for the
25 1998-1999 fiscal year only, expired pursuant to
26 its own terms, effective July 1, 1999.

27
28 Section 4. Paragraph (i) of subsection (5) of section
29 110.123, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

1 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which
2 relates to continued processing of 1996 and
3 1997 state health insurance claims for the
4 1998-1999 fiscal year only, subject to the
5 review and approval process provided in s.
6 216.177, expired pursuant to its own terms,
7 effective July 1, 1999.

8
9 Section 5. Effective July 1, 2000, subparagraph 2. of
10 paragraph (k) of subsection (2) of section 110.205, Florida
11 Statutes, is repealed.

12
13 Reviser's note.--The cited subparagraph, which
14 relates to salary and benefits of officers and
15 employees of the Governor for the 1999-2000
16 fiscal year only, expires pursuant to its own
17 terms, effective July 1, 2000.

18
19 Section 6. Subsection (13) of section 196.011, Florida
20 Statutes, is repealed.

21
22 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
23 relates to granting of a property tax exemption
24 for property entitled to a charitable exemption
25 for the 1994 tax year for which application was
26 not timely filed under certain circumstances,
27 expired pursuant to its own terms, effective
28 May 29, 1999.

30 Section 7. Effective July 1, 2000, subsection (11) of
31 section 199.052, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

1 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
2 relates to requirements for intangible tax
3 returns filed by banking organizations relating
4 to international banking transactions owned by
5 the banking organizations, is repealed by s. 3,
6 ch. 98-132, Laws of Florida, effective July 1,
7 2000. Since the subsection is not repealed by
8 a "current session" of the Legislature, it may
9 be omitted from the Florida Statutes 2000 only
10 through a reviser's bill duly enacted by the
11 Legislature. See s. 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

12
13 Section 8. Sections 199.104 and 220.68, Florida
14 Statutes, are repealed.

15
16 Reviser's note.--The cited sections, which
17 relate to specified tax credits for banks and
18 savings associations, were repealed by s. 8,
19 ch. 98-132, Laws of Florida, "[e]ffective for
20 tax years beginning after December 31, 1999."
21 Since the sections were not repealed by a
22 "current session" of the Legislature, they may
23 be omitted from the Florida Statutes 2000 only
24 through a reviser's bill duly enacted by the
25 Legislature. See s. 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

26
27 Section 9. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section
28 216.292, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

29
30 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which
31 relates to transfer of general revenue funds

1 between the Department of Children and Family
2 Services and the Agency for Health Care
3 Administration, expired pursuant to its own
4 terms, effective July 1, 1999.

5
6 Section 10. Effective July 1, 2000, section 216.349,
7 Florida Statutes, is repealed.

8
9 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
10 relates to financial review of grants and aids
11 appropriations, is repealed by s. 3, ch. 98-91,
12 Laws of Florida, effective July 1, 2000. Since
13 the section is not repealed by a "current
14 session" of the Legislature, it may be omitted
15 from the Florida Statutes 2000 only through a
16 reviser's bill duly enacted by the Legislature.
17 See s. 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

18
19 Section 11. Paragraphs (dd), (ee), and (ff) of
20 subsection (1) of section 220.03, Florida Statutes, are
21 repealed.

22
23 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraphs, which
24 relate to definitions of the terms "fiscal
25 year," "export finance corporation," and
26 "qualified investment," expired pursuant to
27 their own terms, effective June 30, 1999.

29 Section 12. Section 220.188, Florida Statutes, as
30 amended by section 1188 of chapter 95-147, Laws of Florida,
31

1 and section 40 of chapter 96-397, Laws of Florida, is
2 repealed.

3
4 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
5 relates to the export finance corporation
6 investment credit, expired pursuant to its own
7 terms, effective June 30, 1999.

8
9 Section 13. Effective July 1, 2000, subsection (9) of
10 section 253.034, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

11
12 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
13 authorizes the Department of Transportation to
14 sell a specific piece of property utilized by
15 the Department of Highway Safety and Motor
16 Vehicles, expires pursuant to its own terms,
17 effective July 1, 2000.

18
19 Section 14. Effective July 1, 2000, subsection (8) of
20 section 282.3091, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

21
22 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
23 relates to the Task Force on Privacy and
24 Technology, expires pursuant to its own terms,
25 effective July 1, 2000.

26
27 Section 15. Subsection (9) of section 287.064, Florida
28 Statutes, is repealed.

29
30 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
31 relates to financing of certain equipment and

1 services for the Florida Crime Information
2 Center for the 1998-1999 fiscal year only,
3 expired pursuant to its own terms, effective
4 July 1, 1999.

5
6 Section 16. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section
7 338.251, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

8
9 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which
10 relates to a specified loan to the St. Lucie
11 County Expressway Authority for the 1998-1999
12 fiscal year only, expired pursuant to its own
13 terms, effective July 1, 1999.

14
15 Section 17. Section 369.311, Florida Statutes, and
16 section 369.313, Florida Statutes, as amended by section 21 of
17 chapter 99-5, Laws of Florida, are repealed.

18
19 Reviser's note.--The cited sections, which
20 relate to restoration and protection of the
21 Little Wekiva River, were repealed by s. 4, ch.
22 95-315, Laws of Florida, effective July 1,
23 1999. Since the sections were not repealed by a
24 "current session" of the Legislature, they may
25 be omitted from the Florida Statutes 2000 only
26 through a reviser's bill duly enacted by the
27 Legislature. See s. 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

29 Section 18. Section 373.0735, Florida Statutes, is
30 repealed.

23 Section 20. Effective July 1, 2000, paragraph (b) of
24 subsection (6) of section 403.1826, Florida Statutes, is
25 repealed.

26
27 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which
28 relates to waiver of an accumulation
29 requirement for up to 5 years under specified
30 circumstances, expires pursuant to its own
31 terms, effective July 1, 2000.

1 Section 21. Effective March 1, 2000, subparagraph 2.
2 of paragraph (c) of subsection (3) of section 409.912, Florida
3 Statutes, is repealed.

4
5 Reviser's note.--The cited subparagraph, which
6 relates to inapplicability of licensure
7 requirements under parts I and III of chapter
8 641 for specified health centers until March 1,
9 2000, only, expired pursuant to its own terms,
10 effective March 1, 2000.

12 Section 22. Effective July 1, 2000, chapter 442,
13 Florida Statutes, consisting of sections 442.001, 442.002,
14 442.003, 442.004, 442.005, 442.006, 442.007, 442.008, 442.009,
15 442.0105, 442.011, 442.012, 442.013, 442.014, 442.015,
16 442.016, 442.017, 442.018, 442.019, 442.020, 442.021, 442.022,
17 442.023, 442.101, 442.102, 442.103, 442.104, 442.105, 442.106,
18 442.107, 442.108, 442.109, 442.111, 442.112, 442.113, 442.115,
19 442.116, 442.118, 442.1185, 442.119, 442.121, 442.123,
20 442.125, 442.126, 442.127, 442.20, and 442.21, Florida
21 Statutes, is repealed.

23 Reviser's note.--The cited chapter, the Florida

10 expired pursuant to their own terms, effective
11 July 1, 1999.

13 Section 26. Effective July 1, 2000, subsection (9) of
14 section 550.0351, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

15
16 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
17 authorizes certain jai alai permitholders to
18 conduct specified performances, expires
19 pursuant to its own terms, effective July 1,
20 2000.

22 Section 27. Effective June 1, 2000, section 626.993,
23 Florida Statutes, is repealed.

24
25 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
26 relates to viators with dependent children
27 entering into viatical settlement contracts, is
28 repealed by s. 15, ch. 99-212, Laws of Florida,
29 effective June 1, 2000. Since the section is
30 not repealed by a "current session" of the
31 Legislature, it may be omitted from the Florida

1 Statutes 2000 only through a reviser's bill
2 duly enacted by the Legislature. See s.
3 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

5 Section 28. Effective July 1, 2000, paragraph (r) of
6 subsection (1) of section 633.45, Florida Statutes, is
7 repealed.

8
9 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which

11 Trust Fund, is repealed by s. 12, ch. 99-205,
12 Laws of Florida, effective July 1, 2000. Since
13 the paragraph is not repealed by a "current
14 session" of the Legislature, it may be omitted
15 from the Florida Statutes 2000 only through a
16 reviser's bill duly enacted by the Legislature.
17 See s. 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

19 Section 29. Effective July 1, 2000, section 697.203,
20 Florida Statutes, is repealed.

22 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which
