A bill to be entitled An act relating to obscenity; requiring public libraries to install and maintain computer software that prohibits access to obscene materials; requiring that such software be installed and maintained on at least one-half of the computers that a library makes available for public use; providing a finding of important state interest; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Each public library that makes available for public use computer on-line service, Internet service, or local bulletin-board service shall install and maintain computer software that prohibits access to materials that contain obscene descriptions, photographs, or depictions. Such software must be installed and maintained on at least one-half of the library's computers that are available for public use, and, if the library makes only one computer available for public use, such software must be installed and maintained on that computer.

Section 2. In accordance with s. 18, Art. VII of the State Constitution, the Legislature finds that the installation and maintenance by public libraries of computer software that prohibits access to obscene materials fulfills an important state interest.

Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2000.

LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY Requires each public library that allows public access to on-line computer services to install and maintain computer software that prohibits access to obscene materials. Requires that such software be installed and maintained on at least one-half of the computers available to the public.
