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17	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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19	Section 1. Section 741.3165, Florida Statutes, is
20	created to read:
21	741.3165 Certain information exempt from disclosure
22	(1) Any information or records otherwise confidential
23	or exempt from s. $119.07(1)$ and s. $24(a)$ of Art. I of the
24	State Constitution which is obtained by or provided to a
25	domestic violence fatality review team conducting activities
26	as described in s. 741.316 shall remain confidential or exempt
27	as otherwise provided by law. Any portion of the reports
28	produced by the domestic violence fatality review team which
29	contains any information that is otherwise confidential or
30	exempt from s. $119.07(1)$ and s. $24(a)$ of Art. I of the State
31	Constitution shall remain confidential or exempt as otherwise
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1 provided by law. The proceedings and meetings of any domestic violence fatality review team regarding domestic violence 2 3 fatalities and their prevention, during which the identity of the victim or of the children of the victim is discussed, are 4 5 exempt from s. 286.011 and s. 24(b) of Art. I of the State б Constitution. 7 The exemptions in this section apply only to (2) 8 records held by a domestic violence fatality review team. The 9 exemptions contained in this section are subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 10 11 119.15, and this section is repealed October 2, 2005, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the 12 Legislature before that date. 13 The Legislature finds that it is a public 14 Section 2. necessity that information that is confidential or exempt from 15 section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and Section 24(a) of 16 17 Article I of the State Constitution remain confidential or exempt when in the custody of the domestic violence fatality 18 19 review teams, together with any portions of the reports of such teams containing such information. The Legislature 20 further finds that it is a public necessity that proceedings 21 and meetings of the domestic violence fatality review teams 22 which relate to domestic violence fatalities, or domestic 23 violence incidents, and where specific persons or incidents 24 are discussed, be confidential and exempt from public meeting 25 requirements. Otherwise, sensitive personal information 26 27 concerning victims and victims' children and family members would be disclosed and open communication and coordination 28 among parties involved in the domestic violence fatality 29 30 reviews would be hampered. Accordingly, the Legislature finds 31 that the harm that would result in the release of such

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1 information substantially outweighs any minimal public benefit 2 derived therefrom. 3 Section 3. This act shall take effect on the date 4 Senate Bill 1124, relating to domestic violence, or similar 5 legislation becomes law, and shall not take effect if such б legislation does not become law. 7 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR 8 9 Senate Bill 1126 10 11 Removes the state level domestic violence fatality prevention task force. 12 13 Modifies the exemption from disclosure of certain information to apply to information obtained by the domestic violence fatality review teams that is currently confidential or exempt from public disclosure instead of applying to any records obtained or produced 14 15 by the teams. 16 Modifies the exemption from open meetings and proceedings to apply to when the identity of the victim or the children of the victim is discussed instead of applying to meetings and proceedings relating to domestic violence fatalities. 17 18 19 Removes the stipulation that the investigations, proceedings, and records of a domestic violence fatality review team are not subject to discovery or introduction into evidence under certain circumstances. 20 21 Modifies the statement of public necessity to delineate more specifically the circumstances which require the exemption from open meetings and records disclosure. 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31

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
