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1 availability of such services; providing an 2 effective date. 3 4 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 5 6 Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section 7 409.912, Florida Statutes, is amended, and paragraph (e) is added to that subsection, to read: 8 9 409.912 Cost-effective purchasing of health care.--The agency shall purchase goods and services for Medicaid 10 recipients in the most cost-effective manner consistent with 11 12 the delivery of quality medical care. The agency shall maximize the use of prepaid per capita and prepaid aggregate 13 14 fixed-sum basis services when appropriate and other 15 alternative service delivery and reimbursement methodologies, including competitive bidding pursuant to s. 287.057, designed 16 17 to facilitate the cost-effective purchase of a case-managed 18 continuum of care. The agency shall also require providers to 19 minimize the exposure of recipients to the need for acute inpatient, custodial, and other institutional care and the 20 21 inappropriate or unnecessary use of high-cost services. 22 (3) The agency may contract with: 23 (b) An entity that is providing comprehensive behavioral inpatient and outpatient mental health care 24 25 services to certain Medicaid recipients in Hillsborough, 26 Highlands, Hardee, Manatee, and Polk Counties, through a 27 capitated, prepaid arrangement pursuant to the federal waiver provided for by s. 409.905(5). Such an entity must be become 28 29 licensed under chapter 624, chapter 636, or chapter 641 and must possess the clinical systems and operational competence 30 to manage risk and provide comprehensive behavioral health 31 2

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care to Medicaid recipients. As used in this paragraph, the 1 term "comprehensive behavioral health care services" means 2 3 covered mental health and substance abuse treatment services 4 that are available to Medicaid recipients. The Secretary of 5 the Department of Children and Families shall approve 6 provisions of procurements related to children in the 7 department's care or custody prior to enrolling such children 8 in a prepaid behavioral health plan. Any contract awarded 9 under this paragraph must be competitively procured. In developing the behavioral health care prepaid plan procurement 10 document, the agency shall ensure that the procurement 11 12 document requires the contractor to develop and implement a plan to ensure compliance with s. 394.4574 related to services 13 14 provided to residents of licensed assisted living facilities 15 that hold a limited mental health license. The agency must 16 ensure that Medicaid recipients have available the choice of 17 at least two managed care plans for their behavioral health care services. The agency may reimburse for 18 19 substance-abuse-treatment services on a fee-for-service basis 20 until the agency finds that adequate funds are available for 21 capitated, prepaid arrangements. 1. By January 1, 2001, the agency shall modify the 22 23 contracts with the entities providing comprehensive inpatient and outpatient mental health care services to Medicaid 24 recipients in Hillsborough, Highlands, Hardee, Manatee, and 25 26 Polk Counties, to include substance-abuse-treatment services. 2. By December 31, 2001, the agency shall contract 27 with entities providing comprehensive behavioral health care 28 29 services to Medicaid recipients through capitated, prepaid 30 arrangements in Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Escambia, Glades, 31 Hendry, Lee, Okaloosa, Pasco, Pinellas, Santa Rosa, Sarasota, 3

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and Walton Counties. The agency may contract with entities 1 2 providing comprehensive behavioral health care services to 3 Medicaid recipients through capitated, prepaid arrangements in 4 Alachua County. The agency may determine if Sarasota County 5 shall be included as a separate catchment area or included in 6 any other agency geographic area. 7 3. Children residing in a Department of Juvenile 8 Justice residential program approved as a Medicaid behavioral 9 health overlay services provider shall not be included in a behavioral health care prepaid health plan pursuant to this 10 paragraph. 11 12 4. In converting to a prepaid system of delivery, the agency shall in its procurement document require an entity 13 14 providing comprehensive behavioral health care services to 15 prevent the displacement of indigent care patients by enrollees in the Medicaid prepaid health plan providing 16 17 behavioral health care services from facilities receiving state funding to provide indigent behavioral health care, to 18 19 facilities licensed under chapter 395 which do not receive 20 state funding for indigent behavioral health care, or 21 reimburse the unsubsidized facility for the cost of behavioral health care provided to the displaced indigent care patient. 22 23 5. Traditional community mental health providers under contract with the Department of Children and Families pursuant 24 to Part IV of chapter 394 and inpatient mental health 25 26 providers licensed pursuant to chapter 395, must be offered an opportunity to accept or decline a contract to participate in 27 any provider network for prepaid behavioral health services. 28 29 by December 31, 1998, and is exempt from the provisions of part I of chapter 641 until then.
