Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 230.23, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 15 230.23 Powers and duties of school board.--The school 16 17 board, acting as a board, shall exercise all powers and perform all duties listed below: 18 19 (5) PERSONNEL. -- Designate positions to be filled, 20 prescribe qualifications for those positions, and provide for the appointment, compensation, promotion, suspension, and 21 dismissal of employees as follows, subject to the requirements 22 23 of chapter 231: (a) Positions, qualifications, and appointments. -- Act 24 upon written recommendations submitted by the superintendent 25 26 for positions to be filled and for minimum qualifications for 27 personnel for the various positions and act upon written nominations of persons to fill such positions. The 28 29 superintendent's recommendations for filling instructional positions at the school level must be based on nominations 30

received from each school principal. The school board may

reject for good cause any employee nominated. If the third nomination by the superintendent for any position is rejected for good cause, if the superintendent fails to submit a nomination for initial employment within a reasonable time as prescribed by the school board, or if the superintendent fails to submit a nomination for reemployment within the time prescribed by law, the school board may proceed on its own motion to fill such position. The school board's decision to reject a person's nomination does not give that person a right of action to sue over the rejection and may not be used as a cause of action by the nominated employee.

Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (7) of section 230.33, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

230.33 Duties and responsibilities of superintendent.—The superintendent shall exercise all powers and perform all duties listed below and elsewhere in the law; provided, that in so doing he or she shall advise and counsel with the school board. The superintendent shall perform all tasks necessary to make sound recommendations, nominations, proposals, and reports required by law to be acted upon by the school board. All such recommendations, nominations, proposals, and reports by the superintendent shall be either recorded in the minutes or shall be made in writing, noted in the minutes, and filed in the public records of the board. It shall be presumed that, in the absence of the record required in this paragraph, the recommendations, nominations, and proposals required of the superintendent were not contrary to the action taken by the school board in such matters.

(7) PERSONNEL.--Be responsible, as required herein, for directing the work of the personnel, subject to the

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requirements of chapter 231, and in addition the superintendent shall have the following duties:

nominations.—Recommend to the school board duties and responsibilities which need to be performed and positions which need to be filled to make possible the development of an adequate school program in the district; recommend minimum qualifications of personnel for these various positions; and nominate in writing persons to fill such positions. The nominations of persons to fill instructional positions at each of the district's schools must be based on the recommendations received from the principals of the respective schools.

Section 3. Section 231.085, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

231.085 Duties of principals. -- A district school board shall employ, through written contract, public school principals who shall supervise the operation and management of the schools and property as the board determines necessary. The principal is responsible for recommending to the superintendent the employment of instructional personnel to be assigned to the school to which the principal is assigned. Each principal is responsible for the performance of all personnel employed by the school board and assigned to the school to which the principal is assigned. The principal shall faithfully and effectively apply the personnel assessment system approved by the school board pursuant to s. 231.29. Each principal shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the superintendent pursuant to the rules of the school board. Such rules shall include, but not be limited to, rules relating to administrative responsibility, instructional leadership in implementing the Sunshine State Standards and

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the overall educational program of the school to which the
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   principal is assigned, submission of personnel recommendations
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    to the superintendent, administrative responsibility for
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    records and reports, administration of corporal punishment,
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    and student suspension. Each principal shall provide
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    leadership in the development or revision and implementation
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    of a school improvement plan pursuant to s. 230.23(16). Each
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   principal must make the necessary provisions to ensure that
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    all school reports are accurate and timely, and must provide
    the necessary training opportunities for staff to accurately
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    report attendance, FTE program participation, student
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    performance, teacher appraisal, and school safety and
    discipline data. A principal who fails to comply with this
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    section shall be ineligible for any portion of the performance
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    pay policy incentive under s. 230.23(5)(c).
