# I. SUMMARY:

HB 1189 creates the Lake Okeechobee Protection Trust Fund, to be administered by the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). The trust fund will receive legislative appropriations to be used for funding the proposed Lake Okeechobee Protection Program and related Surface Water Improvement and Management (SWIM) activities.

The bill provides the act shall take effect July 1, 2000, if CS/CS/HB 991 or similar legislation is adopted and becomes law. Pursuant to the state Constitution, legislation to create a trust fund requires a three-fifths vote of the House of the Representatives and the Senate.

#### **B. PRESENT SITUATION:**

CS/CS/HB 991, which is tied to HB 1189, provides for creation of the Lake Okeechobee Protection Program.

Pursuant to s. 19, Article III of the State Constitution, no trust fund of the State of Florida or other public body may be created by law without a three-fifths vote of the membership of each house of the legislature in a separate bill for the purpose of creating a trust fund only.

#### C. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

HB 1189 creates the Lake Okeechobee Protection Trust Fund, to be used by the Department of Environmental Protection as a depository for funds designated for implementation of the proposed Lake Okeechobee Protection Program and related Surface Water Improvement and Management (SWIM) activities.

The bill provides that the act shall take effect July 1, 2000, if CS/CS/HB 991 or similar legislation is adopted and becomes law.

#### D. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS:

**Section 1:** Creates s. 373.45952, F.S., the Lake Okeechobee Protection Trust Fund. Provides uses of the trust fund. Specifies that the trust shall be repealed effective July 1, 2004. Provides for legislative review prior to repeal.

**Section 2:** Provides this act shall take effect July 1, 2000, if CS/CS/HB 991 or similar legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.
