## I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Executive Branch Lobby Registration Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Executive Branch Lobby Registration Trust Fund, FLAIR #11-2-203, is administered by the legislative branch. This fund was last recreated effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 96-85, Laws of Florida.

The House substituted SB 596 for HB 1203 prior to final passage on March 15, 2000.

## II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

#### A. PRESENT SITUATION:

## 1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 112.3215, F.S., creates the trust fund, provides a source of revenue for the fund, and defines the uses of the fund.

Section 112.3217, F.S., provides a source of revenue for the fund.

# 2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund is used for the purpose of funding any office established to administer the registration of lobbyists lobbying an agency, including the payment of salaries and other expenses.

# 3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are annual lobbyist registration fees and forfeited benefits. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1998-99 were \$126,900.
