## I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Grants and Donations Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Grants and Donations Trust Fund, FLAIR #60-2-339, is administered by the Department of Children and Family Services. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by 96-115, Laws of Florida.

#### II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

#### A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund tracks receipts and expenditures of various grants received by the department.

#### 3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are private grants, local contributions, and transfers from other entities. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1998-99 were \$25,681,385.90.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
