I. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

This legislation re-creates the Working Capital Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Working Capital Trust Fund, FLAIR #60-2-792, is administered by the Department of Children and Family Services. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 96-126, Laws of Florida.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

- A. PRESENT SITUATION:
 - 1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 216.272, F.S., creates the trust fund and defines the uses of the fund.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund tracks receipts and expenditures associated with the operation of the department's data processing center.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are fees generated through a cost allocation billing system. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1998-99 were \$76,009,002.04.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
