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I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Radiation Protection Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Radiation Protection Trust Fund, FLAIR #64-2-569, is administered by the Department of Health. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 96-123, Laws of Florida.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 404.122, F.S., creates the trust fund and defines the uses of the fund. Sections 404.056, 404.111, 404.131, 404.162, 404.22, and 468.312, F.S., provide sources of revenue for the fund.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund tracks receipts and expenditures associated with the operations of the Office of Radiation Control.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are fees associated with the licensure, registration, and inspection of radiological personnel, equipment, and materials. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1998-99 were \$8.358,025.80.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.

III.	FISCAL ANALYSIS & ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT:
	This legislation has no fiscal impact on state agencies or state funds, on local governments as a whole or on the private sector. It simply re-creates, without modification, an existing state trust fund and continues the current use of the fund.
