I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Florida World War II Veterans Memorial Matching Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Florida World War II Veterans Memorial Matching Trust Fund, FLAIR #50-2-755, is administered by the Department of Veterans' Affairs. This fund was created effective July 1, 1999, by Chapter 99-161, Laws of Florida.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 295.18, F.S., creates the trust fund.

Section 295.182, F.S., provides sources of revenue for the fund and defines the uses of the fund.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund is used to receive donations for the World War II Veterans Memorial.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are private contributions and matching state funds.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
