I. **SUMMARY**:

This legislation re-creates the Local Government Housing Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Local Government Housing Trust Fund, FLAIR #52-2-250, is administered by the Department of Community Affairs. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 96-70, Laws of Florida.

The House substituted SB 488 for HB 1343 prior to final passage on March 15, 2000.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 420.9079, F.S., creates the trust fund, provides sources of revenue for the fund, and defines uses of the fund.

Sections 420.9071, 420.9075, and 420.9076, F.S., provide sources of revenue for the fund.

Sections 201.15, 420.9072, and 420.9078, F.S., define uses of the fund.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund is used to provide funding to local governments as an incentive for the creation of partnerships to provide and preserve affordable housing.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are documentary stamp tax revenues. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1998-99 were \$232,606,195.79.
