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# I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Child Labor Law Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Child Labor Law Trust Fund, FLAIR #54-2-106, is administered by the Department of Labor and Employment Security. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 96-32, Laws of Florida.

The House substituted SB 570 for HB 1361 prior to final passage on March 15, 2000.

## II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

#### A. PRESENT SITUATION:

# 1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 450.155, F.S., creates the trust fund, provides revenue sources for the fund, and defines the uses of the fund.

## 2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund is used to administer the Child Labor Law, to protect the working youth of the state, and to provide education about the Child Labor Law to employers, public school employees, the general public, and working youth.

## MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are fines imposed for cited violations of the labor law which have not been remedied within a specified time period. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1998-99 were \$54,915.29.

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	B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:		
	This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
