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A bill to be entitled
An act relating to homestead exemptions;
amending s. 196.011, F.S.; providing that a
specified part of an applicant's social
security number must be provided on
applications for certain exemptions; providing
an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (11) of section 196.011, Florida
Statutes, is amended to read:

196.011 Annual application required for exemption.--

(11) For exemptions enumerated in paragraph (1)(b),
granted for the 2000 tax year and thereafter, the last four
digits of the social security numbers of the applicant and the
applicant's spouse, if any, are required and must be submitted
to the department. Applications filed pursuant to subsection
(5) or subsection (6) may be required to include the last four
digits of the social security numbers of the applicant and the
applicant's spouse, if any, and shall include such information
if filed for the 2000 tax year or thereafter. For counties
where the annual application requirement has been waived,
property appraisers may require refiling of an application to
obtain such information.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000.

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SENATE SUMMARY

Provides that the last four digits of an applicant's social security number, rather than the entire number, must be provided on an application for exemption to ad valorem taxation enumerated in s. 196.011(1)(b), (5), or (6), F.S.
