I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Florida Public Service Regulatory Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Florida Public Service Regulatory Trust Fund, FLAIR #61-2-573, is administered by the Florida Public Service Commission. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 95-224, Laws of Florida.

The House substituted SB 608 for HB 1415 prior to final passage on March 15, 2000.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 350.113, F.S., creates the trust fund and provides a revenue source for the fund.

Section 350.06, F.S., provides a revenue source for the fund.

Sections 350.031, 366.82, and 427.706, F.S., define the uses of the fund.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The fund is used to fund the operations and administration of the Florida Public Service Commission. The fund also covers the costs associated with the Public Service Commission Nominating Council.

3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major sources of revenue for the fund are fees, licenses, and other charges collected by the commission. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1998-99 were 54,521,623.97.
