 - 4. Policies to ensure the protection of individual privacy and guarantee the exclusive control to a user of its own data.
 - (b) Coordinate the preparation of agency information technology plans within state government, encompassing both short-term and long-term needs that support the agency's and the state's strategic plans.
 - (c) Require each state agency to submit semiannually an agency information technology plan containing the information required by subsection (2) before the legislative session in which the budget request will be heard and no later than June 15 after the legislative session in which the budget was authorized.
 - (d) Upon receipt of a state agency's information
 technology plan:
 - 1. Review and approve or disapprove agency information technology plans to ensure that these plans are the most economically viable and are the best solution to the agency's needs.
 - 2. Approve or disapprove of and coordinate the acquisition of information technology equipment, telecommunications equipment, and related services for all agencies of state government.
