For purposes of the pilot program, notification under s. 229.0537(4)(b) must be separate from the 8 notification under the Opportunity Scholarship Program. 9 10 (b) The school district that participates in the pilot 11 program must comply with the requirements in s. 12 229.0537(3)(a)2., (c), and (d). 13 (c) The amount of the scholarship in the pilot program shall be equal to the amount the student would have received 14 15 under the Florida Education Finance Program in the public 16 school to which he or she is assigned. 17 (d) To be eligible for a scholarship under the pilot 18 program, a student or parent must: Comply with the eligibility criteria in s. 19 1. 20 229.0537(2)(b) and all provisions of s. 229.0537 which apply to students with disabilities; 21 2.
