**7. Prior Legislative History**: An identical bill, HB 2175, passed the House in the

1999 Legislative Session, but was not heard in the Senate as the claimant missed the Senate bill filing

deadline for the 1999 session.

- **B.** Procedural Summary: William D. and Susan G. Mock, husband and wife, sued St. John's County for damages sustained as a result of an accident between a St. John's County ambulance and the motorcycle driven by Mr. Mock. Prior to trial the parties entered into a stipulated settlement resulting in a Consent Order entered by the Court on November 24, 1998. The settlement requires St. John's County to pay Mr. and Mrs. Mock the sum of \$360,000 as compensation for Mr. Mock's injuries and for loss of consortium. The county has already paid \$190,000 of the settlement, leaving \$170,000 to be paid pursuant to the claims bill.
- **C. Facts of Case**: Mr. Mock and a friend were driving their motorcycles through an intersection with a green light. Unbeknownst to him, a St. John's County ambulance traveling in the opposite direction was making a left hand turn across traffic, and in front of Mr. Mock. Both motorcycles crashed into the ambulance, causing the death of one driver, and permanent brain damage to Mr. Mock. The ambulance driver was in apparent violation of s. 316.072, F.S., which allows the driver of an emergency vehicle to disregard traffic regulations as long as the driver does not endanger life or property. Mr. Mock was in apparent violation of s. 316.126, F.S., which requires drivers to yield to emergency vehicles. Prior to the accident, Mr. Mock was a high level human resources consultant. As a result of the accident, Mr. Mock suffers permanent brain damage, blindness in one eye, and the permanent loss of the senses of smell and taste.
