Section 2. Subsection (3) of section 468.4562, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 468.4562 Civil action by institution .--(1) A college or university may sue for damages, as provided by this section, any person who violates this part. A college or university may seek equitable relief to prevent or minimize harm arising from acts or omissions which are or would be a violation of this part. (3) An institution that prevails in a suit brought under this section may recover: (a) Actual damages; (b) Punitive damages; (c) Treble damages; (d)(c) Court costs; and (e) (d) Reasonable attorney's fees. Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2000. HOUSE SUMMARY Provides additional penalties with respect to athletic agents who provide illegal inducements to athletes. Authorizes the award of treble damages to institutions which prevail in civil actions against athletic agents who commit illegal acts in the recruitment of athletes. See bill for details.
