B. PRESENT SITUATION:

The Legislature created the Gasparilla Island Bridge Authority (Authority) in 1996, through chapter 96-507, Laws of Florida. The Authority is an independent special taxing district in Lee and Charlotte Counties. The Authority owns and operates a toll bridge, called the Boca Grande Bridge and Causeway, which crosses Gasparilla Pass in Charlotte County. However, the southern two-thirds of Gasparilla Island is in Lee County. The Authority is managed by a nine-member board of supervisors. The Authority is authorized to fix and collect tolls from persons using the bridge and causeway system.

C. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

The bill codifies all prior special acts relating to the Gasparilla Island Bridge Authority (Authority) in Lee and Charlotte Counties into a single act.

The bill does not change the boundaries of the Authority or make substantive modifications to the power of the Authority.

D. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS:

<u>Section 1</u>: Codifies, reenacts, amends, and repeals special acts relating to the Gasparilla Island Bridge Authority.

Section 2: Recreates and reenacts the Gasparilla Island Bridge Authority:

Section 1: Provides legislative findings

Section 2: Creates the Authority and provides boundaries.

Section 3: Provides the purposes of the Authority.

Section 4: Provides definitions.

Section 5: Provides for governing body of the Authority.

Section 6: Provides the powers and duties of the Authority; including ad valorem taxing powers not to exceed 2.0 mills.

Section 7: Authorizes the Authority to issue bonds and provides how the bonds should be issued and validated.

Section 8: Authorizes the pledging of revenues for the payment of bonds or other obligations.

Section 9: Provides for covenants of the Authority with bondholders.

Section 10: Requires public notice prior to bond issuance.

Section 11: Provides that Authority bonds are negotiable instruments; provides for the rights of bondholders.

Section 12: Provides budget procedure; requires financial and operation reports.

Section 13: Declares that any bonds or other obligations are legal investments for public funds.

Section 14: Authorizes payment for services with bonds.

Section 15: Provides for construction contracts; requires sealed bids.

Section 16: Authorizes conveyance of property to the Authority by governmental entities without consideration.

Section 17. Grants the Authority the same privileges, immunities and exemptions given to the state's political subdivisions; limits the personal liability of Authority members.

Section 18: Exempts property and revenues of the Authority from taxation.

Section 19: Provides penalties for tax delinquency; allows enforcement of taxes through liens and the sale of tax certificates.

Section 20: Provides for the effect of tax liens.

Section 21: Provides special vote requirements for toll structure changes, financing arrangements involving a pledge of assets or other revenues, exercising eminent domain, ad valorem tax referendums and legislative changes to the Authority's charter.

Section 22: Authorizes interlocal agreements.

Section 23: Provides for payment of administrative costs of property appraisers and tax collectors associated with collecting ad valorem taxes.

Section 3: Repeals all prior special acts relating to the Authority's charter.

Section 4: Provides for construction of the act's provisions.

Section 5: Provides for severability.

Section 6: Provides that the act shall be effective upon becoming law.
