Paragraphs (j), (k), and (l) of subsection 10 11 (3) of section 489.105, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 12 489.105 Definitions.--As used in this part: 13 (3) "Contractor" means the person who is qualified 14 for, and shall only be responsible for, the project contracted for and means, except as exempted in this part, the person 15 16 who, for compensation, undertakes to, submits a bid to, or does himself or herself or by others construct, repair, alter, 17 remodel, add to, demolish, subtract from, or improve any 18 19 building or structure, including related improvements to real 20 estate, for others or for resale to others; and whose job scope is substantially similar to the job scope described in 21 22 one of the subsequent paragraphs of this subsection. For the purposes of regulation under this part, "demolish" applies 23 only to demolition of steel tanks over 50 feet in height; 24 towers over 50 feet in height; other structures over 50 feet 25 26 in height, other than buildings or residences over three 27 stories tall; and buildings or residences over three stories 28 tall. Contractors are subdivided into two divisions, Division 29 I, consisting of those contractors defined in paragraphs (a)-(c), and Division II, consisting of those contractors 30 defined in paragraphs (d)-(q): 31

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"Commercial pool/spa contractor" means a (j) contractor whose scope of work involves, but is not limited to, the construction, repair, and servicing of any swimming pool, or hot tub, or spa, whether public, private, or otherwise, regardless of use. The scope of work includes, including the repair or replacement of existing equipment, any cleaning or equipment sanitizing which requires at least a partial disassembling, and or the installation of new pool/spa equipment, including heaters of all types, installation of all perimeter piping and filter piping, and construction of equipment rooms or housing for pool/spa equipment, as necessary. The scope of such work includes layout, excavation, operation of construction pumps for dewatering purposes, steelwork, installation of light niches, construction of floors, guniting, fiberglassing, installation of tile and coping, installation of all perimeter and filter piping, installation of all filter equipment and chemical feeders of any type, plastering of the interior, construction of decks, construction of equipment rooms or housing for pool equipment, and installation of package pool heaters and also includes the scope of work of a swimming pool/spa servicing contractor. However, The scope of such work does not include direct connections to a sanitary sewer system or to potable water lines. The installation, construction, modification, or

25 replacement of equipment permanently attached to and 26 associated with the pool or spa for the purpose of water 27 treatment or cleaning of the pool or spa requires licensure; 28 however, the usage of such equipment for the purposes of water 29 treatment or cleaning shall not require licensure unless the 30 usage involves construction, modification, or replacement of 31 such equipment. Water treatment that does not require such

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equipment does not require a license. In addition, a license shall not be required for the cleaning of the pool or spa in any way that does not affect the structural integrity of the pool or spa or its associated equipment.

5 (k) "Residential pool/spa contractor" means a б contractor whose scope of work involves, but is not limited 7 to, the construction, repair, and servicing of any residential 8 swimming pool, or hot tub, or spa, regardless of use. The scope of work includes, including the repair or replacement of 9 existing equipment, any cleaning or equipment sanitizing which 10 requires at least a partial disassembling, and or the 11 12 installation of new pool/spa equipment, including heaters of 13 all types, installation of all perimeter piping and filter 14 piping, and construction of equipment rooms or housing for 15 pool/spa equipment, as necessary. The scope of such work includes layout, excavation, operation of construction pumps 16 for dewatering purposes, steelwork, installation of light 17 niches, construction of floors, guniting, fiberglassing, 18 19 installation of tile and coping, installation of all perimeter 20 and filter piping, installation of all filter equipment and 21 chemical feeders of any type, plastering of the interior, construction of decks, installation of housing for pool 22 equipment, and installation of package pool heaters and also 23 includes the scope of work of a swimming pool/spa servicing 24 contractor. However, The scope of such work does not include 25 26 direct connections to a sanitary sewer system or to potable 27 water lines. The installation, construction, modification, or 28 replacement of equipment permanently attached to and 29 associated with the pool or spa for the purpose of water treatment or cleaning of the pool or spa requires licensure; 30 31 however, the usage of such equipment for the purposes of water 3

1 treatment or cleaning shall not require licensure unless the 2 usage involves construction, modification, or replacement of 3 such equipment. Water treatment that does not require such 4 equipment does not require a license. In addition, a license 5 shall not be required for the cleaning of the pool or spa in 6 any way that does not affect the structural integrity of the 7 pool or spa or its associated equipment.

8 (1) "Swimming pool/spa servicing contractor" means a contractor whose scope of work involves, but is not limited 9 to, the repair and the servicing and repair of any swimming 10 pool, or hot tub, or spa, whether public or private, or 11 12 otherwise, regardless of use. The scope of such work includes 13 the repair or may include any necessary piping and repairs, 14 replacement and repair of existing equipment, any cleaning or 15 equipment sanitizing which requires at least a partial disassembling, and the or installation of new pool/spa 16 additional equipment, including heaters of all types, as 17 necessary. The scope of such work includes the reinstallation 18 19 of tile and coping, repair or and replacement of all perimeter 20 piping and filter piping, repair of equipment rooms or housing for pool/spa equipment, and the substantial or complete 21 22 draining of a swimming pool, hot tub, or spa for the purposes 23 of any repair or renovation. The scope of such work does not 24 include direct connections to a sanitary sewer system or to 25 potable water lines filter equipment, and chemical feeders of 26 any type, replastering, reconstruction of decks, and reinstallation or addition of pool heaters. The installation, 27 28 construction, modification, substantial or complete 29 disassembly, or replacement of equipment permanently attached to and associated with the pool or spa for the purpose of 30 31 water treatment or cleaning of the pool or spa requires

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licensure; however, the usage of such equipment for the purposes of water treatment or cleaning shall not require licensure unless the usage involves construction, modification, substantial or complete disassembly, or replacement of such equipment. Water treatment that does not require such equipment does not require a license. In addition, a license shall not be required for the cleaning of the pool or spa in any way that does not affect the structural integrity of the pool or spa or its associated equipment. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. HOUSE SUMMARY Amends definitions relating to contracting under pt.
