Subsection (3) of section 458.305, Florida 21 Statutes, is amended to read: 22 458.305 Definitions.--As used in this chapter: 23 (3) "Practice of medicine" means the diagnosis, treatment, operation, or prescription for any human disease, 24 25 pain, injury, deformity, or other physical or mental condition 26 or the modification or denial of a treatment plan for the treatment of any human disease, pain, injury, deformity, or 27 28 other physical or mental condition, including judgments of 29 medical necessity. The "practice of medicine" does not include 30 coverage decisions for purposes of insurance benefits as long

as medical judgments are not involved.

Section 2. Subsection (3) of section 459.003, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
459.003 Definitions.--As used in this chapter:

(3) "Practice of osteopathic medicine" means the diagnosis, treatment, operation, or prescription for any human disease, pain, injury, deformity, or other physical or mental condition or the modification or denial of a treatment plan for the treatment of any human disease, pain, injury, deformity, or other physical or mental condition, which practice is based in part upon educational standards and requirements which emphasize the importance of the musculoskeletal structure and manipulative therapy in the maintenance and restoration of health. The "practice of osteopathic medicine" does not include coverage decisions for purposes of insurance benefits as long as medical judgments are not involved.

Section 3. Subsection (11) of section 641.495, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

641.495 Requirements for issuance and maintenance of certificate.--

director who is a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459. For every adverse determination made by the organization regarding any subscriber, the medical director is required to document and sign the subscriber's medical records setting forth the facts regarding the organization's adverse determination and the rationale for such decision. The rendering of an adverse determination by an organization shall constitute the practice of medicine, as defined in s. 458.305, by the medical director of the organization.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000.

HOUSE SUMMARY Redefines the terms "practice of medicine" and "practice of osteopathic medicine" to include the modification or denial of treatment plans. Provides that the rendering of an adverse determination by a health maintenance organization or prepaid health clinic constitutes the practice of medicine by the medical director of the organization or clinic. With respect to adverse determinations made by a health maintenance organization or prepaid health clinic regarding any subscriber, requires the medical director of the organization or clinic to document and sign the subscriber's medical records setting forth the facts regarding the adverse determination and the rationale for such decision.
