(6) CHILD WELFARE. -- Provide for the proper accounting

(f) Emergency management; emergency

Section 3. Section 235.14, Florida Statutes, is renumbered as section 232.475, Florida Statutes, and amended to read:

232.475 235.14 Emergency management procedures: emergency preparedness drills.--

- (1) The Department of Education shall adopt rules which prescribe minimum standards and model procedures for emergency management and emergency preparedness procedures to be adopted by each district school board which must:
- (a) Require each school to conduct and document no fewer than 10 fire drills per school year.
- (b) Require each school to conduct and document no fewer than 2 tornado drills per school year.

- (c) Establish model emergency management and emergency
 preparedness procedures for the following life-threatening
 emergencies:
 - 1. Weapon use/hostage situations.
 - 2. Hazardous materials/toxic spills.
- 3. Weather emergencies, including hurricanes, tornadoes, and severe storms.
 - 4. Infectious materials exposure.
