2           An act relating to the Florida Statutes;  
3           repealing various statutory provisions that  
4           have become obsolete, have had their effect,  
5           have served their purpose, or have been  
6           impliedly repealed or superseded; repealing s.  
7           14.025, F.S., relating to the Governor's powers  
8           for year 2000 computer remediation; repealing  
9           s. 16.60(5), F.S., relating to a report by the  
10          Attorney General to the Legislature on the  
11          public records mediation program; repealing s.  
12          23.140, F.S., relating to the Southern Growth  
13          Policies Agreement; repealing s. 110.1235,  
14          F.S., relating to employer notice of insurance  
15          eligibility to employees who retire, the  
16          provisions of which are published elsewhere in  
17          statutes; amending s. 240.209, F.S.; deleting a  
18          cross-reference, to conform; providing an  
19          effective date.

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21 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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23           Section 1. Section 14.025, Florida Statutes, is  
24 repealed.

25           Section 2. Subsection (5) of section 16.60, Florida  
26 Statutes, is repealed.

27           Section 3. Section 23.140, Florida Statutes, is  
28 repealed.

29           Section 4. Section 110.1235, Florida Statutes, is  
30 repealed.

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1           Section 5. Paragraph (f) of subsection (3) of section  
2 240.209, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

3           240.209 Board of Regents; powers and duties.--

4           (3) The board shall:

5           (f) Establish and maintain systemwide personnel  
6 programs for all State University System employees, including  
7 a systemwide personnel classification and pay plan,  
8 notwithstanding provisions of law that grant authority to the  
9 Department of Management Services over such programs for state  
10 employees. The board shall consult with the legislative  
11 appropriations committees regarding any major policy changes  
12 related to classification and pay which are in conflict with  
13 those policies in effect for career service employees with  
14 similar job classifications and responsibilities. The board  
15 may adopt rules delegating its authority to the Chancellor or  
16 the universities. The board shall submit, in a manner  
17 prescribed by law, any reports concerning State University  
18 System personnel programs as shall be required of the  
19 Department of Management Services for other state employees.  
20 The Department of Management Services shall retain authority  
21 over State University System employees for programs  
22 established in ss. 110.116, 110.123, 110.1232, 110.1234,  
23 ~~110.1235~~, and 110.1238 and in chapters 121, 122, and 238. The  
24 board shall adopt only those rules necessary to provide for a  
25 coordinated, efficient systemwide program and shall delegate  
26 to the universities all authority necessary for implementation  
27 of the program consistent with these coordinating rules so  
28 adopted and applicable collective bargaining agreements.  
29 Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 216.181(7), the salary  
30 rate controls for positions in budgets under the Board of  
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1 Regents shall separately delineate the general faculty and all  
2 other categories.

3 Section 6. This act shall take effect upon becoming a  
4 law.

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7 LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY

8 Repeals various statutory provisions that have become  
9 obsolete, have had their effect, have served their  
10 purpose, or have been impliedly repealed or superseded.  
11 Repeals provisions relating to the Governor's powers for  
12 year 2000 computer remediation, a report by the Attorney  
13 General to the Legislature on the public records  
14 mediation program, and the Southern Growth Policies  
15 Agreement. Repeals a provision relating to employer  
16 notice of insurance eligibility to employees who retire,  
17 the provisions of which are published elsewhere in  
18 statutes.  
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
