Provides that if the county is not participating in such a program, or if a municipality maintains a radio communication program independent of the county, funds collected may be used to fund local enforcement automation and must be distributed to the municipality or special improvement district in which the violation occurred or to the county if the violation occurred within the unincorporated area of the county. unincorporated area of the county.

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
