A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act for the relief of Elizabeth Schnell and 3 Frederick Schnell; providing an appropriation to compensate them for injuries and damages 4 5 sustained as a result of the negligence of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor б 7 Vehicles; providing an effective date. 8 9 WHEREAS, at 7:15 a.m. on January 25, 1997, Frederick 10 Schnell was operating his motor vehicle, in which his wife 11 Elizabeth Schnell was a passenger, westbound on State Road 60 approximately 1 mile west of Interstate 95 in Indian River 12 13 County, and 14 WHEREAS, Mr. Schnell was traveling at the posted speed 15 limit of 55 miles per hour, and 16 WHEREAS, Trooper Wayne Titus was traveling eastbound on 17 State Road 60 and, for unknown reasons, Trooper Titus abruptly changed lanes and collided head-on with the Schnell vehicle, 18 19 and 20 WHEREAS, Trooper Titus was traveling approximately 71 21 miles per hour at the point of impact, and 22 WHEREAS, the circuit court judge ruled as a matter of law that the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles 23 and the Florida Highway Patrol were responsible for Mr. and 24 Mrs. Schnell's injuries and damages, and 25 26 WHEREAS, Mr. Schnell suffered extensive physical 27 injuries, and 28 WHEREAS, Mr. Schnell continued medical treatment for 29 his physical injuries through April 21, 1997, then discontinued treatment because of the necessity to be with his 30 31 wife, and

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WHEREAS, Mr. Schnell has undergone, and continues to 1 2 undergo, psychiatric treatment and counseling for a permanent 3 psychiatric injury resulting from the accident, and 4 WHEREAS, Mrs. Schnell was transported by helicopter 5 from the scene of the accident to Holmes Regional Medical Center in Melbourne, where she underwent emergency, lifesaving 6 7 surgery to ameliorate a catastrophic brain injury sustained in 8 the accident, and she subsequently underwent four additional 9 surgeries during her hospitalization, and 10 WHEREAS, on March 3, 1997, Mrs. Schnell, who was 11 semicomatose, was transferred to Orlando Regional Medical Center, Sandlake Hospital, and 12 13 WHEREAS, at Sandlake Hospital, Mrs. Schnell began speech, occupational, and physical therapy and underwent 14 another major surgical procedure, and 15 16 WHEREAS, while hospitalized in Orlando, Mrs. Schnell was declared by the court to be an incapacitated person, and 17 18 her husband was appointed her legal guardian, and 19 WHEREAS, on June 24, 1997, Mrs. Schnell was transferred 20 to Healthsouth Treasure Coast Rehabilitation Hospital in Vero Beach and was later transferred to Florida Institute for 21 Neurologic Rehabilitation in Wauchula, Florida, and 22 WHEREAS, she presently requires care 24 hours a day, 23 must use a wheelchair, has paralysis of her right side, has 24 25 moderate loss of her short-term memory, and requires 26 assistance in all her daily activities, and 27 WHEREAS, Mrs. Schnell's doctors and case managers 28 recommend that, upon discharge from the Florida Institute, she 29 be transferred to the home environment and cared for there, with the aid of attendants and residential services, and 30 31 2

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1 continual lifetime speech, occupational, and physical 2 therapies, and 3 WHEREAS, before the accident, Mrs. Schnell was a 4 41-year-old attorney who also had a bachelor's degree and one master's degree, and was working toward a second master's 5 б degree, and 7 WHEREAS, after 7 days of trial, a jury awarded Mrs. 8 Schnell \$875,446 for past medical bills and lost wages, 9 \$9,331,774 for future medical bills and lost wages, \$1 million for past pain and suffering, and \$5 million for future pain 10 11 and suffering, for a total award of \$16,207,220, and 12 WHEREAS, the jury also awarded Mr. Schnell \$41,159 for 13 past medical bills and lost wages and \$4,171 for future lost 14 wages, \$500,000 for past pain and suffering and \$1 million for future pain and suffering, and damages for the loss of his 15 16 wife's consortium in the amount of \$500,000 for past loss and 17 \$1 million for the future, for a total award of \$3,045,330, 18 and 19 WHEREAS, after the jury's verdict was entered, the 20 trial judge ordered a remittitur, reducing the award to Mrs. 21 Schnell to \$14,784,089 and reducing the award to Mr. Schnell 22 to \$2,227,468.84, NOW, THEREFORE, 23 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 24 25 26 Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this 27 act are found and declared to be true. 28 Section 2. The Executive Office of the Governor is 29 directed to transfer existing spending authority from unappropriated trust fund balances in the Department of 30 31 Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in the amount of \$14,784,089 3

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1 to a new category titled "Relief - Elizabeth Schnell" as 2 relief for injuries and damages sustained. Such amount shall 3 be paid in addition to the \$100,000 payable pursuant to 4 section 768.28, Florida Statutes, Florida's sovereign immunity 5 statute.

6 Section 3. The Executive Office of the Governor is 7 directed to transfer existing spending authority from 8 unappropriated trust fund balances in the Department of 9 Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in the amount of \$2,227,468.84 to a new category titled "Relief - Frederick 10 11 Schnell" as relief for injuries and damages sustained. Such 12 amount shall be paid in addition to the \$100,000 payable 13 pursuant to section 768.28, Florida Statutes, Florida's 14 sovereign immunity statute.

Section 4. The Comptroller is directed to draw his warrant in favor of Elizabeth Schnell in the sum of \$14,784,089 upon funds of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in the State Treasury and the State Treasurer is directed to pay the same out of such funds in the State Treasury.

Section 5. The Comptroller is directed to draw his 21 22 warrant in favor of Frederick Schnell in the sum of \$2,227,468.84 upon funds of the Department of Highway Safety 23 and Motor Vehicles in the State Treasury and the State 24 Treasurer is directed to pay the same out of such funds in the 25 26 State Treasury. 27 Section 6. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 28 law. 29
