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## I. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

Current law authorizes the Board of Regents to provide comprehensive general liability insurance, including professional liability insurance, to University Hospital of Jacksonville and Faculty Clinic, Inc.

According to the University of Florida, the daily operation and organizational structure of University Hospital of Jacksonville and Faculty Clinic, Inc. have been assumed by Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc. as of October 1, 1999.

This bill replaces current statutory references to "University Hospital of Jacksonville and Faculty Clinic, Inc." with "Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc." and authorizes the Board of Regents to provide comprehensive general liability coverage, including professional liability coverage, to Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc.; its not-for-profit subsidiaries and affiliates; and any successor corporation that acts in support of the Board of Regents. This coverage is to be provided from the self-insurance programs that current law authorizes the Board of Regents to adopt.

This bill does not appear to have a fiscal impact on state or local governments.

#### B. PRESENT SITUATION:

Section 240.213, F.S., authorizes the Board of Regents to provide comprehensive general liability insurance, including professional liability insurance for health care, to the Board of Regents; its officers, employees, or agents; the students and faculty of any state university; the professional practitioners practicing a profession within or by a state university; any state university; and certain not-for-profit corporations affiliated with a state university that operate in order to benefit a state university in a manner that is consistent with the best interests of the State of Florida. Additionally, s. 240.213, F.S., permits the necessary trust funds in the State Treasury to be established if the Board of Regents adopts a self-insurance program.

Section 240.5135, F.S., authorizes the Board of Regents to provide comprehensive general liability insurance, including professional liability insurance, to University Hospital of Jacksonville and Faculty Clinic, Inc.

According to the University of Florida, the daily operation and organizational structure of University Hospital of Jacksonville and Faculty Clinic, Inc. have been assumed by Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc. as of October 1, 1999.

#### C. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill replaces current statutory references to "University Hospital of Jacksonville and Faculty Clinic, Inc." with "Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc." This bill also authorizes the Board of Regents to provide comprehensive general liability coverage, including professional liability coverage, to Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc.; its not-for-profit subsidiaries and affiliates; and any successor corporation that acts in support of the Board of Regents. This coverage is to be provided from the self-insurance programs that current law authorizes the Board of Regents to adopt.

#### D. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS:

**SECTION 1:** Amends s. 240.5135, F.S., in order to replace references to "University Hospital of Jacksonville and Faculty Clinic, Inc." with "Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc." and authorize the Board of Regents to provide comprehensive general liability coverage, including professional liability coverage, to Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc.; its not-for-profit subsidiaries and affiliates; and any successor corporation that acts in support of the Board of

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Regents from the self-insurance programs that current law authorizes the Board of Regents to adopt.

**SECTION 2:** Establishes that this act will take effect upon becoming a law.
