### B. PRESENT SITUATION:

This money is being sought to build the Melbourne Police Athletic League Community Center in the northern section of Melbourne. This center has been designed to include a gymnasium, offices and classes. Included withthin proposed classes for the center, are classes dealing with basic job training and self-esteem. The center is also slated to be used with programs helping at risk teens. The center will be open to the public, although it will be a Police Athletic League facility. The Police Athletic League is a not-for-profit entity organized under section 501(3)(c). Currently, there are talks with the City of Melbourne to have them maintain the center. There is a need for this facility because the other Melbourne community center in which the Police Athletic League is involved with is overcrowded and its location does not make it accessible to a large segment of the City's population.

Last year, there was a \$1 million general revenue appropriation for the Melbourne Police Athletic League Community Center in the 1999 Appropriations bill. However, this appropriation was vetoed by the Governor.

# C. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill appropriates \$1 million from the General Revenue Fund to the Brevard County Board of County Commissioners for the purpose of constructing the Melbourne Police Athletic League Community Center at a site designated by the Greater Melbourne Police Athletic League Board of Directors. In addition, the bill provides that the Board of County Commissioners is responsible for the disbursement and accountability of the appropriated funds.

### D. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS:

Section 1: Appropriates \$1 million from the General Revenue Fund to the Brevard County Board of County Commissioners; provides the purpose of the appropriation; provides that the Board of County Commissioners is responsible for the disbursement and accountability of the appropriated funds.
