Section 258.166, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 18 19 258.166 Rodman Reservoir Recreation Area 20 designated. -- There is designated and established a state 21 recreation area to be known as Rodman Reservoir Recreation 22 Area, in Marion and Putnam counties, which shall include all 23 state-owned lands within the floodplain of the Oklawaha River 24 and those hereafter acquired by the state from Eureka Dam in Marion County to Buckman Lock in Putnam County. Those lands 25 26 are deemed and held to be a state recreation area, under the 27 supervision of the Division of Recreation and Parks of the 2.8 Department of Environmental Protection, and the division is 29 charged with the duty of providing for the development of 30 multipurpose recreational opportunities at this recreation

the Rodman Reservoir Recreation Area including all those dams, locks, and other structures transferred by the federal government to the state. Any action that would substantially alter the recreation area as it existed on January 1, 2000, must be approved by law.

- (1) The Division of State Lands of the Department of Environmental Protection may acquire in the name of the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund any additional property adjacent or contiguous to the Rodman Reservoir Recreation Area, from private owners or from the United States Government for improved management and recreational opportunities.
- (2) The Division of State Lands shall identify, contact, and inform all property owners who entered into easements located within the taking line of the Rodman Reservoir of the designation of this area as a state recreation area.
- (3) By January 1, 2001, the Division of State Lands shall submit a report to the Executive Office of the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives which:
- (a) Identifies the entities that have an easement within the taking line of the reservoir.
- (b) Indicates whether the holder of the easement is willing to sell the easement.
 - (c) Estimates the cost of acquiring the easements.
- $\underline{\mbox{(d)}}$ Identifies any additional issues resulting from this designation.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

SENATE SUMMARY Designates an area in the floodplain of the Oklawaha River in Marion and Putnam counties as the Rodman Reservoir Recreation Area under the supervision of the Department of Environmental Protection. Authorizes the acquisition of additional land and requires the notification of persons with easements in the recreation area. Requires a report to the Governor and the Legislature.
