Paragraph (g) of subsection (2) of section 14.2015, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 26 27 14.2015 Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic 28 Development; creation; powers and duties .--(2) The purpose of the Office of Tourism, Trade, and 29 30 Economic Development is to assist the Governor in working with 31 the Legislature, state agencies, business leaders, and 1

economic development professionals to formulate and implement coherent and consistent policies and strategies designed to provide economic opportunities for all Floridians. To accomplish such purposes, the Office of Tourism, Trade, and

6 (q) Serve as contract administrator for the state with 7 respect to contracts with Enterprise Florida, Inc., the 8 Florida Commission on Tourism, and the direct-support organization created under s. 288.1229 all direct-support 9 10 organizations under this act, excluding those relating to 11 tourism. To accomplish the provisions of this act and applicable provisions of chapter 288, and notwithstanding the 12 provisions of part I of chapter 287, the office shall enter 13 into specific contracts with Enterprise Florida, Inc., the 14 Florida Commission on Tourism, and the direct-support 15 organization created under s. 288.1229 other appropriate 16 17 direct-support organizations. Such contracts may be multiyear, and shall include specific performance measures for each year, 18 19 and shall provide for recovery of state assets in a manner 20 consistent with the provisions of this paragraph in the event 21 of termination. Upon dissolution of the party contracting with the office, the contracted party shall cease incurring debt, 22 and all assets of the contracted party held in trust shall be 23 24 reverted to the state for use by the office for satisfaction of outstanding debt. After such satisfaction, all assets 25 remaining shall be used by the office for carrying out its 26 27 duties under this section and chapter 288. Assets of the 28 contracted party held in trust include money, whether from 29 public, private, or third-party sources; real property; and 30 tangible and intangible personal property. The provisions for 31

Subsection (1) of section 288.1224, Florida 4 Statutes, is amended to read: 5 288.1224 Powers and duties.--The commission: б (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of part I of 7 chapter 287, upon the approval of the Office of Tourism, 8 Trade, and Economic Development, shall contract, no later than December 31, 1996, with the Florida Tourism Industry Marketing 9 10 Corporation, a direct-support organization of the commission 11 created under s. 288.1226 a direct-support organization 12 incorporated as a private, not-for-profit corporation, as defined in s. 501(c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, 13 as amended, to execute the tourism marketing and promotion 14 services, functions, and programs for this state including, 15 but not limited to, the activities prescribed by the 4-year 16 17 marketing plan. The contract shall provide for recovery of state assets in a manner consistent with the provisions of 18 19 this subsection in the event of termination. The Office of 20 Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development shall review such contract in an expedient manner and shall timely make any 21 recommendations so as to allow for the date of the contract to 22 be met. The commission shall serve as contract administrator. 23 24 Upon dissolution of the corporation, the corporation shall 25 cease incurring debt, and all assets of the corporation held in trust shall be reverted to the state for use by the Office 26 27 of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for satisfaction of outstanding debt. After such satisfaction, all assets 28 29 remaining shall be used to carry out the duties of the office 30 under s. 14.2015 and this chapter. Assets of the corporation 31 held in trust include money, whether from public, private, or

third-party sources; real property; and tangible and intangible personal property. The provisions for dissolution contained in this subsection shall be deemed to be part of the contract. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000. б SENATE SUMMARY Provides that, on dissolution of the contracted party in a contract between the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development and Enterprise Florida, Inc., the Florida Commission on Tourism, and the direct-support organization created to promote the sports industry, or the dissolution of the Florida Tourism Industry Marketing Corporation, the assets of the contracted party or the corporation revert to the state for use by the department. department.
