Manufacture, sale, or possession of 12 military-style weapon prohibited; penalty.--13 (1) A person may not manufacture, import into this state, distribute, sell, offer for sale, give, lend, or 14 possess any military-style weapon. 15 16 (2) As used in this section, the term "military-style 17 weapon" means: (a) A semiautomatic, centerfire rifle that has the 18 19 capacity to accept a detachable magazine and any one of the 20 following: 21 1. A pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath 22 the action of the weapon. 23 2. A thumbhole stock. 24 3. A second handgrip. 25 4. A folding or telescoping stock. 26 5. A grenade launcher or flare launcher. 27 6. A threaded barrel capable of accepting a flash 28 suppressor, forward handgrip, or silencer. 29 7. A flash suppressor. 30 (b) A semiautomatic, centerfire rifle that has a fixed magazine with the capacity to accept more than 10 rounds. 31 1

1 (c) A semiautomatic, centerfire rifle that has an overall length of less than 30 inches. 2 3 (d) A semiautomatic pistol that has the capacity to accept a detachable magazine and any of the following: 4 5 1. A threaded barrel. б 2. A second vertical handgrip. 7 A shroud that is attached to, or partially or 3. 8 completely encircles, the barrel and that allows the bearer to 9 fire the weapon without burning his or her hand, except a 10 slide that encloses the barrel. 11 4. The capacity to accept a detachable magazine outside the pistol grip. 12 (e) A semiautomatic pistol having a fixed magazine 13 14 that has the capacity to accept more than 10 rounds. 15 (f) A semiautomatic shotgun that has: 1. A folding or telescoping stock; and 16 A pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath 17 2. the action of the weapon, thumbhole stock, or vertical 18 19 handgrip. 20 (g) A semiautomatic shotgun that can accept a 21 detachable magazine. (h) Any shotgun that has a revolving cylinder. 22 (3) Any person who violates this section commits a 23 felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in section 24 775.082, section 775.083, or section 775.084, Florida 25 Statutes. 26 27 Section 2.
