to support or oppose issues or candidates are not political committees if their political activities are limited to contributions to candidates, political parties, or political committees or expenditures in support of or opposition to an issue from corporate or business funds and if no contributions are received by such corporations or business entities.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

HOUSE SUMMARY

Modifies the basic definition of "political committee" to mean a combination of two or more individuals, or a person other than an individual, the major purpose of which is to support or oppose any candidate, issue, or political party. Defines "major purpose" as accepting contributions or making expenditures which expressly advocate the election or defeat of a candidate or issue during a calendar year in an aggregate amount in excess of \$500.
