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28	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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30	Section 1. Section 229.555, Florida Statutes, is
31	amended to read:
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1 229.555 Educational planning and information 2 systems.--

(1) EDUCATIONAL PLANNING.--

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4 The commissioner shall be responsible for all (a) 5 planning functions for the department, including collection, б analysis, and interpretation of all data, information, test 7 results, evaluations, and other indicators that are used to 8 formulate policy, identify areas of concern and need, and 9 serve as the basis for short-range and long-range planning. Such planning shall include assembling data, conducting 10 11 appropriate studies and surveys, and sponsoring research and 12 development activities designed to provide information about 13 educational needs and the effect of alternative educational 14 practices.

15 (b) Each district school board shall maintain a 16 continuing system of planning and budgeting designed to aid in identifying and meeting the educational needs of students and 17 the public. Provision shall be made for coordination between 18 19 district school boards and community college district boards 20 of trustees concerning the planning for vocational and adult 21 educational programs. The major emphasis of the system shall 22 be upon locally determined goals and objectives, the state plan for education, and the Sunshine State Standards developed 23 by the Department of Education and adopted by the State Board 24 of Education. The district planning and budgeting system must 25 26 include consideration of student achievement data obtained 27 pursuant to s. 229.57. The system shall be structured to meet 28 the specific management needs of the district and to align the 29 budget adopted by the district school board with the plan the board has also adopted. Each district school board shall 30 utilize its system of planning and budgeting to emphasize a 31

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system of school-based management in which individual school
 centers become the principal planning units and to integrate
 planning and budgeting at the school level.

4 (2) COMPREHENSIVE MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS. -- The 5 commissioner shall develop and implement an integrated information system for educational management. The system must 6 7 be designed to collect, via electronic transfer, all student 8 and school performance data required to ascertain the degree to which schools and school districts are meeting state 9 performance standards, and must be capable of producing data 10 11 for a comprehensive annual report on school and district performance. In addition, the system shall support, as 12 13 feasible, the management decisions to be made in each division 14 of the department and at the individual school and district levels. Similar data elements among divisions and levels 15 16 shall be compatible. The system shall be based on an overall conceptual design; the information needed for such decisions, 17 including fiscal, student, program, personnel, facility, 18 19 community, evaluation, and other relevant data; and the 20 relationship between cost and effectiveness. The system shall 21 be managed and administered by the commissioner and shall 22 include a district subsystem component to be administered at the district level, with input from the reports-and-forms 23 control management committees. Each district school system 24 with a unique management information system shall assure that 25 26 compatibility exists between its unique system and the 27 district component of the state system so that all data 28 required as input to the state system is made available via 29 electronic transfer and in the appropriate input format. (a) The specific responsibilities of the commissioner 30 shall include: 31

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Consulting with school district representatives in
 the development of the system design model and implementation
 plans for the management information system for public school
 education management;

5 2. Providing operational definitions for the proposed6 system;

3. Determining the information and specific data
elements required for the management decisions made at each
educational level, recognizing that the primary unit for
information input is the individual school and recognizing
that time and effort of instructional personnel expended in
collection and compilation of data should be minimized;

13 4. Developing standardized terminology and procedures14 to be followed at all levels of the system;

15 5. Developing a standard transmittal format to be used16 for collection of data from the various levels of the system;

17 6. Developing appropriate computer programs to assure
18 integration of the various information components dealing with
19 students, personnel, facilities, fiscal, program, community,
20 and evaluation data;

7. Developing the necessary programs to provide statistical analysis of the integrated data provided in subparagraph 6. in such a way that required reports may be disseminated, comparisons may be made, and relationships may be determined in order to provide the necessary information for making management decisions at all levels;

27 8. Developing output report formats which will provide
28 district school systems with information for making management
29 decisions at the various educational levels;

30 9. Developing a phased plan for distributing computer31 services equitably among all public schools and school

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districts in the state as rapidly as possible. The plan shall 1 2 describe alternatives available to the state in providing such 3 computing services and shall contain estimates of the cost of each alternative, together with a recommendation for action. 4 5 In developing the plan, the feasibility of shared use of б computing hardware and software by school districts, community 7 colleges, and universities shall be examined. Laws or 8 administrative rules regulating procurement of data processing 9 equipment, communication services, or data processing services 10 by state agencies shall not be construed to apply to local 11 agencies which share computing facilities with state agencies; 12 10. Assisting the district school systems in 13 establishing their subsystem components and assuring 14 compatibility with current district systems; 15 11. Establishing procedures for continuous evaluation 16 of system efficiency and effectiveness; Initiating a reports-management and 17 12. forms-management system to ascertain that duplication in 18 19 collection of data does not exist and that forms and reports 20 for reporting under state and federal requirements and other 21 forms and reports are prepared in a logical and uncomplicated 22 format, resulting in a reduction in the number and complexity of required reports, particularly at the school level; and 23 24 13. Initiating such other actions as are necessary to 25 carry out the intent of the Legislature that a management 26 information system for public school management needs be 27 implemented. Such other actions shall be based on criteria 28 including, but not limited to: 29 The purpose of the reporting requirement; a. The origination of the reporting requirement; 30 b. 31

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1 The date of origin of the reporting requirement; c. 2 and 3 d. The date of repeal of the reporting requirement. 4 (b) The specific responsibilities of each district 5 school system shall include: 6 1. Establishing, at the district level, a 7 reports-control and forms-control management system committee 8 composed of school administrators and classroom teachers. The 9 district school board shall appoint school administrator members and classroom teacher members; or, in school districts 10 11 where appropriate, the classroom teacher members shall be 12 appointed by the bargaining agent. Teachers shall constitute a 13 majority of the committee membership. The committee shall 14 periodically recommend procedures to the district school board for eliminating, reducing, revising, and consolidating 15 16 paperwork and data collection requirements and shall submit to the district school board an annual report of its findings. 17 2. With assistance from the commissioner, developing 18 19 systems compatibility between the state management information 20 system and unique local systems. 21 3. Providing, with the assistance of the department, 22 inservice training dealing with management information system purposes and scope, a method of transmitting input data, and 23 the use of output report information. 24 25 Establishing a plan for continuous review and 4. evaluation of local management information system needs and 26 27 procedures. 28 5. Advising the commissioner of all district 29 management information needs. 30 31

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Transmitting required data input elements to the 1 6. 2 appropriate processing locations in accordance with guidelines 3 established by the commissioner. 4 7. Determining required reports, comparisons, and 5 relationships to be provided to district school systems by the system output reports, continuously reviewing these reports 6 7 for usefulness and meaningfulness, and submitting recommended 8 additions, deletions, and change requirements in accordance with the guidelines established by the commissioner. 9 10 8. Being responsible for the accuracy of all data 11 elements transmitted to the department. 12 (c) It is the intent of the Legislature that the 13 expertise in the state system of public education, as well as 14 contracted services, be utilized to hasten the plan for full implementation of a comprehensive management information 15 16 system. (3) RULES.--The State Board of Education shall adopt 17 rules to administer this section. 18 19 Section 2. Paragraph (c) is added to subsection (1) of 20 section 229.565, Florida Statutes, to read: 21 229.565 Educational evaluation procedures .--22 (1) STUDENT PERFORMANCE STANDARDS.--(c) The Commissioner of Education shall develop a 23 course description that provides the essential content and 24 25 course requirements for each course in grades 6 through 12 26 which are contained in the Course Code Directory and 27 Instructional Personnel Assignments. When appropriate and 28 feasible, the course descriptions must incorporate the approved student performance standards. 29 Section 3. Section 232.022, Florida Statutes, is 30 amended to read: 31

232.022 Attendance defined.--1 2 (1) The attendance of all public school pupils shall 3 be checked each school day in the manner prescribed by 4 regulations of the state board and recorded in the teacher's 5 register or by some approved system of recording attendance. б Pupils may be counted in attendance only if they are actually 7 present at school or are away from school on a school day and 8 are engaged in an educational activity which constitutes a 9 part of the school-approved instructional program for the 10 pupil. 11 (2) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to 12 administer this section. 13 Section 4. Section 232.0225, Florida Statutes, is 14 amended to read: 15 232.0225 Absence for religious instruction or holidays.--Each school board, in accordance with rules of the 16 State Board of Education, shall adopt a policy that which 17 authorizes a parent or guardian to request and be granted 18 19 permission for absence of a student from school for religious 20 instruction or religious holidays. Section 5. Paragraph (q) is added to subsection (1) of 21 section 236.081, Florida Statutes, to read: 22 23 236.081 Funds for operation of schools.--If the annual 24 allocation from the Florida Education Finance Program to each 25 district for operation of schools is not determined in the 26 annual appropriations act or the substantive bill implementing 27 the annual appropriations act, it shall be determined as 28 follows: 29 COMPUTATION OF THE BASIC AMOUNT TO BE INCLUDED FOR (1) OPERATION. -- The following procedure shall be followed in 30 31

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determining the annual allocation to each district for 1 2 operation: 3 (q) Computation for funding through the Florida 4 Education Finance Program. -- For student membership in a 5 program or course to generate funding through the Florida б Education Finance Program and for students in grades 9 through 7 12 to receive elective or required credit toward high school 8 graduation for such a program or course, the following 9 conditions must be met: 10 1. The course or program in which the student is in membership must be an educational activity that constitutes a 11 12 part of the instructional program approved by the district 13 school board. 14 2. The course or program must be listed in the Course 15 Code Directory and Instructional Personnel Assignments 16 developed by the Department of Education for the year in which the student is in membership. The Commissioner of Education 17 may publish the directory in appropriate and useful formats, 18 19 such as a printed copy, an electronic database, or an 20 electronic disc. The Commissioner of Education may approve additional courses for which funding could be generated 21 22 through the Florida Educational Finance Program. 23 Section 6. Subsection (11) is added to section 24 240.1201, Florida Statutes, to read: 240.1201 Determination of resident status for tuition 25 26 purposes. -- Students shall be classified as residents or 27 nonresidents for the purpose of assessing tuition fees in 28 public community colleges and universities. 29 (11) An alien who possesses any category of nonresident visa or other classification from the United 30 States Immigration and Naturalization Service must provide 31 9

proof of permanent status to be classified as a resident for 1 tuition purposes. An eligible alien may be classified as a 2 3 state resident 12 months after the time he or she establishes 4 legal state residence for tuition purposes. An alien who 5 possesses a visa of a category issued for purposes of attending a postsecondary institution in the United States 6 7 must be classified as a nonresident for tuition purposes. The 8 State Board of Education shall designate by rule which 9 categories of a visa or other classifications from the United 10 States Immigration and Naturalization Service authorize an 11 alien to be classified as a resident for tuition purposes. Section 7. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 12 13 law. 14 15 16 SENATE SUMMARY 17 Authorizes the State Board of Education to adopt rules governing the planning and information system of the Department of Education, school attendance, and the classification of aliens as residents for tuition 18 purposes. Authorizes the Commissioner of Education to 19 adopt rules providing course descriptions. Requires that a school board's policy authorizing absences for religious instruction or holidays be in accordance with rules of the State Board of Education. Revises requirements for determining the annual allocation for school districts under the Florida Education Finance Program. (See bill for details.) 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30

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
