(1) EDUCATIONAL PLANNING.--

4 (a) The commissioner shall be responsible for all 5 planning functions for the department, including collection, 6 analysis, and interpretation of all data, information, test 7 results, evaluations, and other indicators that are used to 8 formulate policy, identify areas of concern and need, and 9 serve as the basis for short-range and long-range planning. Such planning shall include assembling data, conducting 10 appropriate studies and surveys, and sponsoring research and 11 12 development activities designed to provide information about educational needs and the effect of alternative educational 13 14 practices.

(b) Each district school board shall maintain a 15 16 continuing system of planning and budgeting designed to aid in 17 identifying and meeting the educational needs of students and the public. Provision shall be made for coordination between 18 19 district school boards and community college district boards of trustees concerning the planning for vocational and adult 20 educational programs. The major emphasis of the system shall 21 be upon locally determined goals and objectives, the state 22 23 plan for education, and the Sunshine State Standards developed by the Department of Education and adopted by the State Board 24 of Education. The district planning and budgeting system must 25 26 include consideration of student achievement data obtained pursuant to s. 229.57. The system shall be structured to meet 27 the specific management needs of the district and to align the 28 29 budget adopted by the district school board with the plan the board has also adopted. Each district school board shall 30 utilize its system of planning and budgeting to emphasize a 31

system of school-based management in which individual school 1 2 centers become the principal planning units and to integrate 3 planning and budgeting at the school level. 4 (2) COMPREHENSIVE MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS. -- The 5 commissioner shall develop and implement an integrated 6 information system for educational management. The system must 7 be designed to collect, via electronic transfer, all student 8 and school performance data required to ascertain the degree 9 to which schools and school districts are meeting state performance standards, and must be capable of producing data 10 for a comprehensive annual report on school and district 11 12 performance. In addition, the system shall support, as 13 feasible, the management decisions to be made in each division 14 of the department and at the individual school and district Similar data elements among divisions and levels 15 levels. shall be compatible. The system shall be based on an overall 16 17 conceptual design; the information needed for such decisions, 18 including fiscal, student, program, personnel, facility, 19 community, evaluation, and other relevant data; and the relationship between cost and effectiveness. The system shall 20 be managed and administered by the commissioner and shall 21 include a district subsystem component to be administered at 22 23 the district level, with input from the reports-and-forms control management committees. Each district school system 24 with a unique management information system shall assure that 25 26 compatibility exists between its unique system and the 27 district component of the state system so that all data required as input to the state system is made available via 28 29 electronic transfer and in the appropriate input format. (a) The specific responsibilities of the commissioner 30 shall include: 31

Providing operational definitions for the proposed 6 system; 7 Determining the information and specific data 3. 8 elements required for the management decisions made at each 9 educational level, recognizing that the primary unit for information input is the individual school and recognizing 10 that time and effort of instructional personnel expended in 11 12 collection and compilation of data should be minimized; 4. Developing standardized terminology and procedures 13 14 to be followed at all levels of the system; 15 5. Laws or 8 administrative rules regulating procurement of data processing 9 equipment, communication services, or data processing services by state agencies shall not be construed to apply to local 10 agencies which share computing facilities with state agencies; 11 12 10.
