Section 220.701, Florida Statutes, is 21 amended to read: 220.701 Collection authority. -- The department shall 22 23 deposit the revenues it collects from collect the taxes 24 imposed by this chapter as follows: (1) Seven percent of the amount collected in fiscal 25 26 year 2000-2001, and one percent of the amount collected in each year thereafter, shall be deposited into the Rural 27 28 Economic Development Trust Fund, if that trust fund is otherwise created by law. 29 30

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The remaining balance collected each year shall be deposited and shall pay all moneys received by it into the General Revenue Fund of the state.

Section 2. Paragraph (d) of subsection (2) and subsection (4) of section 288.0655, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

288.0655 Rural Infrastructure Fund.--

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- By September 1, 2000 1999, the office shall pursue execution of a memorandum of agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture under which state funds available through the Rural Infrastructure Fund may be advanced, in excess of the prescribed state share, for a project that has received from the department a preliminary determination of eligibility for federal financial support. State funds in excess of the prescribed state share which are advanced pursuant to this paragraph and the memorandum of agreement shall be reimbursed when funds are awarded under an application for federal funding.
- (4) By September 1, 2000 1999, the office shall, in consultation with the organizations listed in subsection (3), and other organizations, develop guidelines and criteria governing submission of applications for funding, review and evaluation of such applications, and approval of funding under this section. The office shall consider factors including, but not limited to, the project's potential for enhanced job creation or increased capital investment, the demonstration of local public and private commitment, the location of the project in an enterprise zone, the location of the project in a community development corporation service area as defined in 31 $\frac{1}{8}$ s. 290.035(2), the location of the project in a county

designated under s. 212.097, the unemployment rate of the 1 surrounding area, and the poverty rate of the community. 2 3 Section 3. The Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development, Enterprise Florida, Inc., and the Florida Tourism 4 5 Industry Marketing Corporation, in consultation with the participating agencies and organizations of the Rural Economic 6 7 Development Initiative, shall develop a strategic plan for the 8 use of the Rural Infrastructure Fund under s. 288.0655, 9 Florida Statutes, as well as other available programs, to 10 support economic development activities in rural communities 11 in the state. The plan shall, at a minimum, consider the 12 appropriate timing and priority for development of 13 infrastructure in support of nature-based and other rural tourism, implementation of marketing initiatives directed 14 toward the use of such tourism infrastructure, creation of 15 16 microenterprise and other businesses in the tourism industry, 17 and development of infrastructure in support of other economic development activities.
