Short title.--This act may be cited as the 18 "Keith Ward Act." 19 Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (15) of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 20 21 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases 22 as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth 23 unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 24 (15)25 (c)1. Effective October 1, 1999, "special risk member" 26 means a member of the Florida Retirement System who is 27 designated as a special risk member by the division in 28 accordance with s. 121.0515. Such member must be employed as a law enforcement officer, a firefighter, a correctional 29 30 officer, an emergency medical technician, or a paramedic and 31

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must meet certain other special criteria as set forth in s.
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    121.0515.

   member" also includes any member who is employed as a
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    correctional probation officer and meets the special criteria
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    set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(e); and any member who is employed
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   by the Department of Corrections in one of the following

27	(2) CRITERIAA member, to be designated as a special
28	risk member, must meet the following criteria:
29	(a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement
30	officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in
31	compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected

 police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;

- (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of the employer or agency of state government. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires or direct supervision of firefighting units, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;
- (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility,

or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, superintendents and assistant superintendents shall participate in the Special Risk Class; or

- (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene emergency medical care. However, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; or:
- (e) The member must be employed as a correctional probation officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or community controllees within institutions of the community; or the member must be the supervisor of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;

1 however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit 2 administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class. 3 Section 4. The Legislature finds that a proper and 4 legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees 5 of the state and of its political subdivisions, and the 6 dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and 7 retirees, are extended the basic protections afforded by governmental retirement systems that provide fair and adequate 8 benefits and that are managed, administered, and funded in an 9 10 actuarially sound manner, as required by Section 14 of Article X of the State Constitution and part VII of chapter 112, 11 12 Florida Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature determines and declares that the provisions of this act fulfill an important 13 14 state interest. 15 Section 5. This act shall take effect January 1, 2001. 16 17 18 SENATE SUMMARY Creates the "Keith Ward Act" to include correctional probation officers and other employees of the Department of Corrections in the Special Risk Class of the Florida Retirement System provided they meet prescribed criteria and include probation and parole regional administrators in the Special Risk Class.
