Section 6. (1) The Division of Historical Resources of the Department of State, in conjunction with representatives from Florida's Big Bend counties, including Calhoun, Columbia, Dixie, Franklin, Gadsden, Gilcrist, Gulf, Hamilton, Holmes, Jackson, Jefferson, Lafayette, Leon, Liberty, Levy, Madison, Suwannee, Taylor, Union, Wakulla, and Washington counties, municipalities, and post-secondary educational institutions, shall develop a regionally based study for the protection, preservation, restoration and promotion of historically significant sites, objects and landmarks to this area and to the state. The study shall include, but not be limited to the following:

(a) Identification of the needs, including financial, of the region in protection, preservation, restoration and

16 representatives from southwest Florida counties, including
17 Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands,
18 Lee, Manatee, Okeechobee and Sarasota, municipalities, and
19 post-secondary educational institutions, shall develop a
20 regionally based study for the protection, preservation,
21 restoration and promotion of historically significant sites,
22 objects and landmarks to this area and to the state. The
23 study shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
24 (a) Identification of the needs, including financial,
